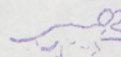

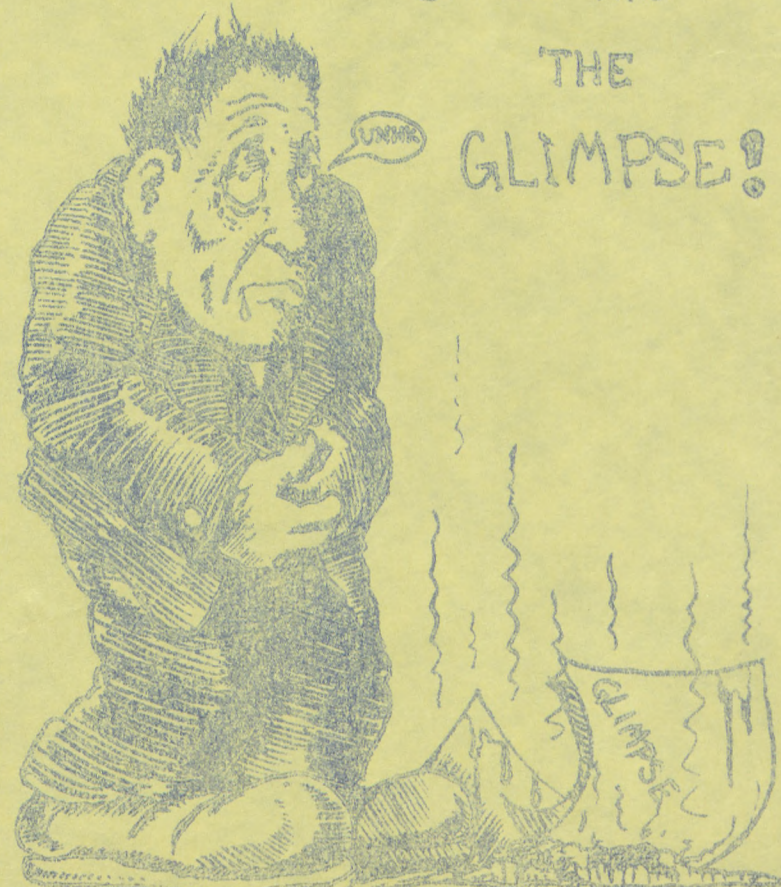

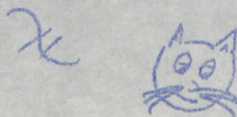

SOCIAL VIOLATIONS HEARING BOARD REPORT

The SVHB met on Monday December 13, 1971, in a closed hearing to hear a case in which a charge was brought by a male student of the College in which it was alleged that a sophomore male student had violated the "Proscriptions on Conduct" #4 which states:

Physical abuse of any member of the College community or any other person on Colleg premises or at College-sponsored or College-supervised functions or conduct which threatens or endangers the health or safety of any such person.

The SVHB accepted the plea of the party as guilty of violating proscription no. 4 and imposed Sanction 6, which can be found on page 34 of the 1971 Mermaid's Tale. In accordance with that Sanction, the offender is to be suspended for the Spring Semester of the 1971-72 academic year. The rationale given by the Board for the sanction of suspension is based upon the nature of the evidence heard during the course of the hearing.
