#### SVHB REPORT

...the SVHB found a junior male student not guilty of charges levied by a sophomore male; namely, that he allegedly had violated proscription \$3 of the "Proscriptions on Conduct", which deals with "Intentional obstruction or disruption of teaching, reasearch...or other College activities." Specifically, he was accused of disrupting a meeting of the Dickinson Chapter of the Association of the U.S. Army on Feb. 10.

Although he was found innocent, the Board issued a verbal rebuke, on grounds that his action was detrimental to "free inquiry and free expression by all members of the academic community," as expressed on pg. 23 of the Mermaid's Tale.
