ARSON BY MOUSE

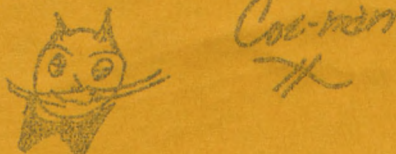
