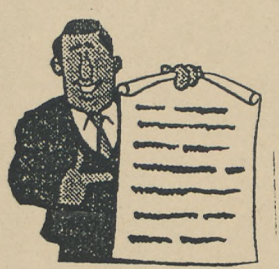
## Goals

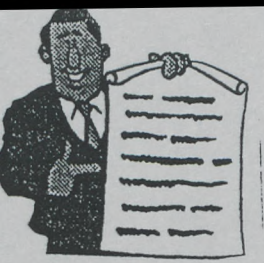

## Residence Hall Cable T.V. News

The College is currently seeking student opinion on whether or not students would like to see cable television in each residence hall room on campus. The Senate decided the best way to seek such an opinion would be to hold a vote on this issue. Therefore, on Friday, November 17th students are encouraged to voice their opinion in the HUB Lower Level during lunch hours by casting a ballot. Other questions will be asked pertaining to the extent of service that will be provided if students were to receive cable.

First, however, the specifics must be looked at. To install the network wiring in general will cost \$970,000. Of that amount, \$370,000 is specifically for the cable system, including satellite antennas and other black box electronics. The college can **not** afford to pay for this service, therefore, students would be asked to pay over a period of six years. The first cost would be for the system. For this service, students would need to pay approximately \$77.00 per room, per year. This would just pay for the system to be implemented. Then, costs for receiving channels, and system maintenance would cost \$30-\$40 annually per room for plain vanilla channels. Premium services would obviously add to the cost. These charges would be added to ones room fees on a yearly basis, therefore, persons living in college-owned off-campus houses and students studying away from the campus would not be assessed the charge. It should be understood that these fees will be charged for six years, until the system is paid off, and **all students** will be required to pay.

So, the bottom line. Installing cable t.v. in all residence hall rooms will cost each room approximately \$117.00 minimum per year, to be added to one's room charges. This will be implemented for sure by fall semester of the next academic year. Please make your opinion known on this issue by either voting in the lower level of the HUB on Friday, November 17th, or by e-mailing senate. Don't hesitate to contact the senate office if you have any questions on this matter.
