TWO IMPORTANT EVENTS:

1) <u>Informative</u>— On November 10, 1988, the Jewish Community (as well as the non-Jewish Community) is commeorating the 50th Anniversary of <u>Kristallnacht</u>. The following exerpt is for those who are unaware of this most violent beginning in Hitler's plan to annilate the European Jewish population:

The term "Kristallnacht" ("Night of Broken Glass") refers to the organized anti-Jewish riots in Germany and Austria, November 9-10, 1938. These riots marked a major transition in Nazi policy, and were, in many ways, a harbinger of the "Final Solution."

Nazi antisemitic policy began with the systematic legal, economic, and social disenfranchisement of the Jews. This was accomplished in various stages (e.g. The Nuremberg Laws of 1935, which, among other things, stripped German Jews of their citizenship.) One of these steps involved the deportation of Polish Jews who were residing in Germany (est. 56,500). On the night of October 27, 1938, 18,000 Polish Jews were deported, but were initially refused entry into Poland by the Polish authorities. Caught in between, the Jews were forced to camp out in makeshift shelters. Upon hearing that his family was so trapped, 17 year-old Herschel Grynszpan, a student in Paris, shot the third secretary of the German Embassy, Ernst vom Rath, whom he mistook for the ambassador. This assassination served as a welcome pretext for the German initiation of Kristallnacht. While it is hard for us to understand what happened fifty years ago, it is quintessential for you to attend. It is only fitting and appropriate that we remember what happened then because the lesson to be learned has no importance to those who innocently perished; rather, the lesson is to be learned by us and then passed on to those who follow us. This isn't a matter to be taken lightly! So, on the behalf of members of the board, we cordially invite you to attend a talk by Professor Harry Booth of Dickinson's Religion Department at 7 PM on November 3rd in the Hillel House (Behind Tome).
