My dear Sir,

Sarcaston 23 July 1838.

I am just about setting out for a farm, which I am obliged to visit annually, in the mountains of Pennsylvania, & shall be absent for several weeks. I cannot, however, deny myself the pleasure of waiting until I can acknowledge the receipt of your very kind & acceptable letter. Most cordially do I reciprocate the kind sentiments towards myself which you express; and it will ever afford me pleasure to serve you should circumstances place it in my power.

I have not yet received from Washington a single copy of the Report. The cause of the delay I cannot imagine. If you will be kind enough to drop me a line a fortnight hence, I shall endeavor to have your reports franked to you from Washington.

I feel much gratified that Gov: Kent has been pleased with my efforts, which has, in truth, called forth more commendation than it deserves.

After all the care we took, "the province of Quebec" ^[in Treaty] was substituted for that of Nova Scotia in the second paragraph of the 6th page.
