This was done; and forwarded to the Navy agent at Philadelphia by direction of the late Mr. Southard then the Secretary of the Navy. After its quality had been fully tested, it was pronounced equal to the best Russia hemp & the owner was paid for it at this rate by the Department. The experiment fully ascertained that the American was equal the foreign article; but there it ended. The farmers of this County could not be prevailed upon the adopt or continue the practice of water rolling.

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When you undertook the task of instructing the hemp growers in the West the art of water-rolling hemp in such a manner as to render it a healthy employment & had entered into a contract with the Secretary of the Navy to furnish the Department with a quantity of the article, I felt a lively interest in your success. This induced me to watch your progress with much solicitude. I had many conversations with you on the subject. The result of your labors has been a great benefit to the Country. We now have an ample supply of an article necessary for self defence; whilst its cultivation has been & will continue to be a source of profit to many of our agriculturalists.
