Sir, I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your note of the 17th ult., requesting, on behalf of your Government, that the vessels of the squadron of the United States on the Pacific station, might be directed to abstain from entering the ports and harbors of Peru not open to foreign commerce. A translation of the same having been communicated to the Secretary of the Navy, I have the honor to enclose a copy of a letter from him to this Department on the subject, dated the 24th instant, from which it will
