I have adopted the sule for reasons which yet appear to me to be conclusive; and however agreeable it would be to me to oblige you, I ful myself relationsly compelled to act lowards you as I have done to all other querids in simular circumstances. If one thing, however, you may be well apured; - That my reconsentation would be of but lettle survice to you, from your friend J. G. Washington Eg amer Muchanang

Lancaster 18 October 1842

My dear Sir/

I have received yours of the 15th. Instant, & hasten to give it an answer. Our friends Read & Page are perfectly acquainted with my course of conduct since the present administration came into power. I have recommended no friend for office; although I have been appealed to in the most earnest manner by individuals whom I should most gladly have served. I have adopted this rule for reasons which yet appear to me to be conclusive; and however agreeable it would be to me to oblige you, I feel myself reluctantly compelled to act towards you as I have done to all other friends in similar circumstances. Of one thing, however, you may be well assured;- <u>that my recommendation would be of but little service to you</u>.
