I have just received from Mrs Grayson a package containing all the drawings & note books of Col. Grayson made during many years residence in Mexico. These she sends with a view of ascertaining whether any one can be found to publish them. The figures are all of life size, & in style intermediate between the works of Audubon & Wilson. A few are well drawn, & all are carefully & accurately colored; but a great majority full entirely short of that elegance which we are accustomed to demand, after training in the school of Wolf & his colleagues.

Mrs Grayson values the Collection very highly, having insured it for the sum of \$1,000, in sending it on. She wishes you to examine the Collection & aid in determining what disposition to make of it.

If you say so, I will forward them to you at once;
the notes may be of service to you in your paper
on the birds of northwestern Mexico. You will
have to take good care of the Collection, how-
ever, & in case of its destruction by fire, you
will be held considerably responsible for it. I am
