The specimens of Attila also received, for which am obliged, the Mazatlan bird seems to me distinct from citreopygius, I am puzzled for a name, think of cinnamomeus as it is of that color above quite uniformly. much lighter than citreopygius which is brownish red. graysoni will not do as their are already two in my paper. I think it will be better to take another of the specimens of wrens for the type of insulans, instead of the one you marked. as they differ so much, probably the effect of Alcohol as you suggest.
