Sir,

Not being assured of a safe Conveyance for the Originals, I beg Leave to commit to your Care the enclosed Copies of two Bonds from Mess<u>rs</u> Coleman, Old, & Hough, the two last being sureties for the former.

My respectful Endeavors to accommodate Mr. Coleman have at Length Subjected Me to such Inconveniences, that I am compelled to insist on the Discharge of the Debt.

By my last Letter to him, I requested him to make early payments, and that the whole might be satisfied next November.

This is my earnest Wish, dictated by the Exigencies of my Affairs; and I desire your permission to rely on your prudence for its Accomplishment. Your Attention will be gratefully acknowledged.

Such unexpected Events have lately taken Place, that I should be very glad, to have the Debt perfectly secured as soon as possible. The Interest has been paid up

to the first of April 1786.

It is my Intention to exhibit my Demand to the Commissioners of Bankrupts, as a Creditor of Mr. Hough, as I presume, that step will not cause any Obstruction to proceedings against the other Obligors.

You will oblige Me, if You will be so good, as to advise Me of the Receipt of these Papers, & of the Measures you may think proper to take-
