Dear Governor-

Leut [Urquart?], the bearer, of Battery D, 2nd Pa Artillery, is from this county, and an intelligent, efficient & reliable officer. Over two hundred men have been recruited from this county by him and others for the regiment: there is but one commissioned officer from the county, while several vacancies exist & have existed for some time owing to your differences with the Colonel, as I am informed.

I wish to say that Leut [Urquart?] is in all respects a soldier & [credible?], and he would be glad to make some

statements relative to the [aggregation?], in asmuch as the Colonel does not serve as a medium for the [fanfare?] .
