THE NOMINEES ARE...

BEST PICTURE

<u>TITANIC</u> Titanic ties 1950's All About Eve, as the most nominated film of all time. The \$200 million budget initially raised a few eyebrows, but *Titanic* is well on its way to grossing a record-setting \$1 billion.

<u>AS GOOD AS IT GETS</u> When Holly Hunter backed out of the leading female role, director James L. Brooks wasn't sure how good his film would get. After a year of rewrites and refilming numerous scenes, *As Good as it Gets* was good enough to get seven Oscar nominations.

GOOD WILL HUNTING If it hadn't been for their friend Kevin Smith, Matt Damon and Ben Affleck's "underdog" film may still be waiting in limbo at Castle Rock. Smith convinced his studio, Miramax, to pick up the film, catapulting these two childhood buddies to stardom.

THE FULL MONTY Writer, Simon Beaufoy never expected his story to turn into anything more than just a cult film. Made for a mere \$3 million, *The Full Monty* has grossed over \$200 million worldwide and snagged four Oscar Nominations.

L.A. CONFIDENTIAL Hailed as the best bad-guy flick since Chinatown (nominated for Best Picture '94), L.A. Confidential was considered Oscar's favorite...that is until *Titanic* sank em all.

BEST DIRECTOR

<u>IAMES CAMERON</u> As director, writer, producer and editor of *Titanic*, Cameron has finally broken free from the sci-fi action genre—his previous directing credits include *Aliens*, *The Abyss, and Terminator 2*.

<u>GUS VAN SANT</u> With directing credits for *Drugstore Cowboy*, *My Own Private Idaho*, and *To Die For*, Van Sant was the first choice of *Good Will Hunting's* writers. Miramax execs, however took nine months to give in and offer him the job.

<u>PETER CATTANEO</u> In order to make *The Full Monty* cast more comfortable exposing their less-than-perfect bodies, Cattaneo took his clothes off too. "Not all of them," he said, "I didn't want to make them ill."

<u>ATOM EGOYAN</u> Referred to as a "floppy-haired, enigmatic braniac," Egoyan's nomination for the *Sweet Hereafter*, is said to be the Oscar surprise of the year.

<u>CURTIS HANSON</u> Five years ago when Hanson picked up a copy of James Ellroy's novel, he knew that *L.A. Confidential* was the story he'd been waiting for. Despite the tough sell studios, he intentionally avoided casting A-list stars to avoid any Hollywood "baggage."



THE NOMINEES ARE...

BEST ACTOR

<u>IACK NICHOLSON</u> As the obsessive compulsive, dog-hating, bigot in *As Good as it Gets*, Nicholson has earned his 11th Academy Award nomination, setting a new record for male actors.

ROBERT DUVALL Duvall received his first Best Actor nomination for *The Great Santini*, a role for which he never even rehearsed. Sonny Dewey, the Pentecostal preacher, wasn't his only role in *The Apostle*—he also wrote, directed, and financed the film.

<u>MATT DAMON</u> Five years after co-scripting *Good Will Hunting*, Damon finally got a chance to play his title character, moving himself from relatively unknown actor to Hollywood's A-list.

DUSTIN HOFFMAN Hoffman's performance as an ego-driven Hollywood producer in Wag the Dog is a far cry from the gentle autistic Rain Man, which won Hoffman his second Oscar. His character's catch phrase, "This is nothing," is said to be this year's version of "Show me the money."

PETER FONDA Fonda had to hack off his waist-length ponytail to win the part of beekeeper Ulee Jackson in *Ulee's Gold*. The role, initially offered to Nick Nolte, is said to be Fonda's finest since *Easy Rider*, nearly thirty years ago.

BEST ACTRESS

HELEN HUNT

Helen Hunt has been acting since the age of ten, with roles including an alien child in *The Bionic Woman*. The leap from small screen to big screen has not always been kind to thespians. As Good as it Gets marks Hunt's fifteenth film.

KATE WINSLET Shortly before the filming of *Titanic* began, Winslet professed her desire to play "a Valley Girl in a feel-good American movie." Although her role as Rose didn't fulfill that wish, it did win the twenty year old actress her second Oscar nomination.

IULIE CHRISTIE Although today's moviegoers may not remember Julie Christie as Lara in *Doctor Zhivago*, her role as the neglected wife in *Afterglow* has been hailed as Christie's "second coming."

IUDI DENCH At age 63, Mrs. Brown marks Dench's first leading role after forty years of acting. While most recognize her only as "M" from the last two Bond movies, Dench received the title of Dame ten years ago, the female equivalent of British Knighthood.

HELEN BONHAM CARTER

Bonham Carter, a seemingly permanent fixture in period films, was reportedly thrilled to say goodbye to tight corsets to play a manipulative, scheming seductress in *The Wings of the Dove*.

THE NOMINEES ARE...

BEST SUPPORTING ACTRESS

KIM BASINGER A former *Breck Girl* and *Playboy* model, 1997 is said to the year Basinger has "redeemed herself." Her performance as Lynn Bracken, a high-priced call girl in *L.A. Confidential*, has already won her a Golden Globe.

<u>GLORIA STUART</u> Stuart, age 87, went through two hours of makeup each day to play the role of 101 year old Rose in *Titanic*. Director James Cameron cast Stuart after seeing her as a young blond actress in her 1932 film, *The Old Dark House*.

IOAN CUSACK By the time *In & Out* finished shooting, Cusack could barely fit into her wedding dress costume—she was already four months pregnant. Although comedy performances are often said to be neglected from the Oscars, this is Joan's second nomination for a comedic role.

MINNIE DRIVER Good Will Hunting marks Driver's fifth major film role, and her fifth time cast as "the love interest." Her role of Harvard student, Skylar, was originally planned for Claire Danes.

<u>IULIANNE MOORE</u> Filmmaker Paul Thomas Anderson met Julianne Moore for the first time at a party, telling her "You're going to be in my movie." He wrote *Boogie Nights* with Moore in mind and persistently pursued her for the part of porn star Amber Waves.

BEST SUPPORTING ACTOR

BURT REYNOLDS Barring his role as tabloid favorite during his messy split from Loni Anderson, Reynolds' performance as the porn king in *Boogie Nights* is said to be the comeback of the year.

GREG KINNEAR Kinnear confesses that playing the role of a gay man in *As Good as it Gets* was a little uncomfortable, especially in the company of such superstars like Jack Nicholson and Helen Hunt. Kinnear says the real challenge, however, was working so closely with his canine co-star, Jill.

<u>ANTHONY HOPKINS</u> Dashing between sets while simultaneously filming *Amistad* and *The Mask of Zorro*, Hopkins admits he did not have time to do his usual historic research for his performance of former president John Quincy Adams.

ROBERT FORSTER Leave it to Quentin Tarintino to turn a B-movie fixture into an Oscar nominated actor. Forster considers his Max Cherry role in *Jackie Brown* to be a "life challenger" for him.

ROBIN WILLIAMS Good Will Hunting marks Williams' fourth Academy nomination, but his first in a supporting role. Matt Damon and Ben Affleck who co-wrote Hunting, are still not over the shock of getting "Mork" in their movie.
