

# And The Mominees Are... Best Picture Best Director

American Beauty: An unremarkable man is trapped in a suburban wasteland, Lester Burnham is experiencing a midlife crisis that will be a catalyst for explosive change and no one will escape the blast of his self-destruction. American Beauty has scored eight Oscar nominations.

Cider House Rules: The Cider House Rules explores how far we must travel to find a place where we belong. Homer Wells experiences life outside of St Cloud's, an orphanage run by Dr. Wilbur Larch, and discovers that his destiny is his own to create. The Cider House Rules is nominated for seven Academy Awards.

The Insider: With seven Oscar nominations, The Insider is based on a true story of producer Lowell Bergman's battle with CBS executives to air an interview with tobacco industry whistle-blower Jeffrey Wigand on "60 Minutes". The riveting docudrama explores the relationship between an impassioned journalist and an ordinary man caught in a web of extraordinary circumstances.

The Green Mile: Adapted from Stephen King's serialized novel, The Green Mile explores an unusual friendship between prison guard, Paul Edgecomb, and convicted killer, John Coffey. Edgecomb discovers that the massive inmate is a gentle giant who possesses miraculous powers. The Green Mile has been nominated for four Oscars.

The Sixth Sense: Eight-year-old Cole Sear is haunted by a dark secret: he is visited by ghosts in The Sixth Sense, a film that is nominated for six Oscars. A helpless and reluctant channel, he is terrified by threatening visions from those with unresolved problems that appear from the shadows. Child psychologist Dr. Malcolm Crowe tries to uncover the ominous truth about the boy's powers and leads them both to something harrowing- and unexplainable.

Sam Mendes: In his feature film directorial debut with American Beauty, Mendes receives his first Academy Award nomination. He has previously directed for the stage.

**Spike Jonze:** Being John Malkovich marks the feature-length directorial debut of award winning music video, short film and commercial director Jonze. For three consecutive years, his work has been featured in the Sundance Film Festival.

Lasse Hallström: The Cider House Rules gives Hallström his second nomination for Best Director. The Swedish director began his career in television and directing several music videos, notably for the band ABBA.

Michael Mann: Mann made his motion picture directorial debut in 1981 while writing screenplays. His direction for The Insider marks his third Academy Award nomination.

M. Night Shyamalan: Shyamalan made his motion picture writing and directorial debut with a low-budget independent film Praying With Anger in 1992. He is nominated for Best Director and Writer for a Screenplay Directly Written for the Screen for The Sixth Sense.

Russell Crowe: Crowe portrays tobacco industry whistle-blower, Jeffrey Wigand, the head of research and development for a major tobacco firm and the first of his kind to go public with corporate secret in The Insider. This is the first Academy Award nomination for Russell Crowe.

Richard Farnsworth: Farnsworth portrays Alvin Straight who, in 1994, drove his lawnmower from Iowa to Wisconsin in order to see his ailing brother in The Straight Story. This is the second Academy Award nomination for Richard Farnsworth, but the first for a performance by an Actor in a Leading Role.

Sean Penn: Penn portrays the role of wild and eccentric 1930s jazz guitar genius Emmet Ray in Sweet and Lowdown. This is the second Academy Award nomination for Sean Penn in the category of Actor in a Leading Role.

Kevin Spacey: Spacey portrays Lester Burnham in American Beauty who is a down-sized executive experiencing a mid-life meltdown in picture perfect suburbia. A winner in 1995 for a Performance by an Actor in a Supporting Role for The Usual Suspects, this is the second Academy Award nomination for Kevin Spacey.

Denzel Washington: Washington portrays professional boxer Rubin Carter whose dreams of winning the middleweight boxing title were destroyed when he is wrongly accused, convicted and imprisoned for the murders of three men in The Hurricane. Washington received an Academy Award in 1989 for a Performance by an Actor in a Supporting Role, this nomination marks his fourth nomination.

Annette Bening: Bening portrays picture-perfect housewife, Carolyn Burnham in American Beauty. This is Bening's second Academy Award nomination and her first for a Performance by an Actress in a Leading Role.

Janet McTeer: McTeer portrays Mary Jo Waker, who picks up her daughter and moves to another location each time a love affair ends in Tumbleweeds. The British actress received a Tony Award for her U.S. stage debut in "A Doll's House" and is now up for her first Academy Award nomination.

Julianne Moore: Moore portrays Sarah Miles, a woman in The End of the Affair whose sterile marriage makes her seek passion outside of the union with a handsome and brooding writer, only to leave him reeling when she suddenly breaks off the affair without explanation. This is Moore's second Academy Award nomination and her first for a Performance by an Actress in a Leading Role.

Meryl Streep: Streep portrays Roberta Guaspari in Music of the Heart, a woman who goes head-to-head with an entrenched bureaucracy, determined that her students will not be shortchanged when her music program's funding is cut. The two-time Oscar winning actress receives her twelfth Academy Award nomination and the tenth for a Performance by an Actress in a Leading Role.

Hilary Swank: Swank portrays a young woman masquerading as Brandon, a young man consumed with love, whose blossoming romance ends in tragedy. This is Swank's first Academy Award nomination.

Michael Caine: Caine portrays Dr. Wilbur Larch, the head of a New England orphanage who takes an interest in and tutors one boy in the art of medicine hoping that he will one day take his place. This is the Oscar-winning actor's fifth Academy Award nomination and his second for Performance by an Actor in a Supporting Role.

**Tom Cruise:** Cruise portrays Frank Mackey, the angry leader of a men's movement in Magnolia. This is his third Academy Award nomination and first nomination for Performance by an Actor in a Supporting Role.

Michael Clarke Ducan: Duncan portrays John Coffey, a physically imposing convicted murder, who possesses miraculous powers that bring a prison guard to doubt his guilt in The Green Mile. This is Duncan's first Academy Award nomination.

Jude Law: Law portrays Dickie Greenleaf, the playboy son of a millionaire ship builder who spends his idle time on the sunny Mediterranean in The Talented Mr. Ripley. This is the British actor's first Academy Award nomination.

Haley Joel Osment: Osment portrays Cole Sear, an 8-year-old boy haunted by the dark secret that he cannot tell anyone; he sees dead people. A winner of the Youth Film Award for his role as Forrest, Jr. in Forrest Gump in 1994, this is the young actor's first Academy Award nomination.

### Best Supporting Actress

All first time Academy Award nominees

Toni Collette: Collette portrays Lynn Sear, an increasingly worried single mother unable to penetrate the fears of her 8-year-old son Cole. This is the Australian actress' made her acting debut in the 1994 comedy Muriel's Wedding.

Angelina Jolie: Jolie portrays the charming sociopath, Lisa who repeatedly escapes from a mental institution in Girl, Interrupted. Jolie made her motion picture debut in 1995's Without Evidence.

Catherine Keener: Keener portrays Maxine, the beautiful coworker who charms the married Craig Schwartz in Being John Malkovich. Keener made her film debut in the romantic comedy About Last Night in 1986.

Samantha Morton: Morton portrays Hattie, a mute waif, in Sweet and Lowdown. Morton began acting on television in her native England.

Chlöe Sevigny: Sevigny portrays the restless, doe-eyed Lana, who falls for Brandon, the new boy in town in Boys Don't Cry. Sevingy made her feature film debut in KIDS in 1995.




