BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Samuel Deetz was born in Quakertown, PA on April 21, 1951 and was one of eight children. His father was a minister, so his family moved from place to place throughout his childhood, until they came back to Central PA where Deetz finished high school. While living at home after high school, Deetz started working as an accountant, which led him to continue a career in accounting.

Deetz became active in the LGBTQ+ community in his mid-twenties in the 1970s. He, with help from Mark Seagal, founded the Susquehanna Valley Gays United (SVGU) in the summer of 1975. He was a member of the PA Rural Gay Caucus from its inception in 1975 until 1978, where he was co-chair for the first Gay Lobby (Education) Day in March 1976 and became the convenor of the Legislative Committee. He was invited to become a member of the PA Governor's Council for Sexual Minorites in 1976, where he became a facilitator between the Rural Gay Caucus and the Council, as well as the Council and the PA State Police Department. He also was treasurer for the Pennsylvania for Social Justice Political Action Committee (PAC) from 1982 to 1985.

Besides his public activism, Deetz personally help developed Equality, which was a social media site for breaking news, blogs, and updates on LGBTQ+ issues from across the world, and professionally continued in his career as an accountant. He later moved to Delaware with his partner Jim.

Deetz passed away in 2019.

COLLECTION DESCRIPTION

This collection highlights Deetz's activism in various LGBTQ+ groups in Central PA. Deetz was an accountant by trade which enabled him to hold treasurer positions in most of these organizations.

Series 1 and **Series 2** cover his time within two Political Action Committees (PAC), which are political committees organized for the purpose of raising and spending money to elect and defeat candidates in voting elections. These specific PACs focus on general and state elections.

Series 3 focuses on Deetz's time on the Planning Committee for the PA Rural Gay Caucus's Gay Lobby (Education) Day in March of 1976. **Series 4** contains information on the planning of the statewide Pride '78 conference.

Series 5 and **Series 6** are shorter series that pertain to Deetz's time on the PA Governor's Council for Sexual Minorites and Humans Rights Day Committee, respectfully.

Series 7 contains local newspaper clippings, both regular and oversized, **Series 8** holds photographs of Deetz and fellow LGBTQ+ activists, and **Series 9** houses miscellaneous items from the collection.

Series 10 contain artifacts which include buttons, pins, a t-shirt, and a souvenir from Pride '78. At the end, there is an appendix which contains a bibliography of books that were donated with this collection and can be accessed upon request.

COLLECTION INVENTORY

SERIES 1 - Network PAC

The Network Political Action Committee (PAC) was created by the Pennsylvania Lesbian/Gay Support Network (PALGSN) in June of 1982. At the second meeting, it was voted to re-name and reorganize the PAC into a Federal PAC to expand their fundraising capabilities. The Network PAC became the Pennsylvania for Social Justice PAC in July of 1982, and the PALGSN was no longer connected to the new PAC. This series contains general information about the Network PAC during its short lifespan.

SERIES 2 – Pennsylvania For Social Justice PAC

The Pennsylvania for Social Justice PAC was a federal and state recognized Political Action Committee. It formed out of the Network PAC in July of 1982 and was officially recognized as a separate PAC in October of 1982. The goal of the PAC was to endorse and support local and federal candidates that supported LGBTQ+ rights, along with other socially progressive issues like that of reproductive rights and the Equal Rights Amendment. The PAC lasted until November of 1985.

Sub-Series in this series include: General Business, which has membership lists and a list of Gay Organizations; Meeting Minutes and Agendas; Election Commission Information, which includes information on their Federal and State Commission recognition; Financial Information, which includes bank statements and funding records; Fundraising and Donations Information; items pertaining to the 1982, 1983, and 1984 elections, that includes candidates that they endorsed and supported; Correspondence about candidate support and funding of the PAC; Contact Cards, which were used as the organizations address book of contacts and was originally housed in a Rolodex; and Miscellaneous items.

SERIES 3 – PA Rural Gay Caucus Gay Lobby Day

The PA Rural Gay Caucus Gay Lobby Day (also knowns as Gay Education Day) was an event hosted by the PA Rural Gay Caucus to educate legislators about the need for LGBTQ+ rights, anti-discrimination laws, and most importantly to encourage the repeal of sodomy laws in the PA Legislature in March of 1976. Citizens from various districts throughout PA came to Harrisburg to lobby their respective representatives.

SERIES 4 – Pride '78

Pride '78 was the second statewide gay conference and was organized by the PA Rural Gay Caucus and Governor's Council on Sexual Minorities. Originally planned to be held in January of 1978, after location issues due to discrimination against hosting a LGBTQ+ conference at the initial venue and then a snowstorm during the weekend of the initial dates, the conference was rescheduled to April of 1978. With its success, the fight for LGBTQ+ rights and education continued to expand, with resolutions establishing the conference as an annual event, endorsing the formation of statewide LGBTQ+ support groups and networks, encouraging the participation of racial and sexual minorities withing the LGBTQ+ community, and supporting of the Equal Rights Amendment (E.R.A).

This series contains General Information about conference planning; Correspondence about planning; Financial Information containing registration fees and donation information; and Contact Cards, which were used by the conference organizers as an address book of contacts and originally housed in a Rolodex.

SERIES 5 – PA Governor's Council for Sexual Minorities

The Governor's Council on Sexual Minorites was an officially appointed advisory committee created by Governor Milton J. Shapp in 1976. Governor Shapp, by executive order, declared that all executive branch offices and services were to end discriminatory practices and policies against all LGBTQ+ employees, clients, and program of state services. The council was his instrument for the implementation of his decree throughout the Executive Branch of state government. Council committees consisted of knowledgeable LGBTQ+ activists appointed by Governor Shapp to work side-by-side with official state employees to monitor and rewrite government regulations and practices to reflect the executive order. Deetz was a member of the Council from February 1976 to October 1977. This series contains Deetz's appointment letter, travel expenses, and resignation letter.

The Human Rights Day Committee was part of the Coalition for Human Rights, which was a coalition made up of the PA Rural Gay Caucus and other local activist groups. The Coalition coordinated Humans Rights Day in May 1977, which took the place of the Gay Lobby/Education Day of the prior year and endorsed pro-civil-liberties legislation which included LGBTQ+ rights.
