BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Peg (Stoppard) Welch was born in December 1951 near Chester County, Pennsylvania. As a young mother to two children, Peg did not graduate from high school, but received her GED and worked at various jobs, eventually joining Parents Without Partners where she met her second husband, Phil. With his help supporting their family, she was able to graduate from Millersville University with a degree in social work, afterwards working at Big Brothers Big Sisters, the United Way, the YWCA, and Planned Parenthood. At the YWCA, Peg met her future wife, Delma Welch. Peg was an active member in York Area Lambda, helped to establish the Lesbian Alliance, and was involved in activism to get LGBT ordinances passed with the York City Human Relations Commission.

Delma Welch was born in Washington D.C. and grew up in Cardiff, Maryland with her three brothers and one sister. Delma began going to National Organization for Women (NOW) meetings in 1975 after becoming interested in feminism. After being in a relationship with a man for 23 years, she met her future wife, Peg (Stoppard) Welch, at the YWCA. Today, Peg and Delma live in York, PA.

COLLECTION DESCRIPTION

This collection has six series: Activism, Newspaper Clippings, Magazine Articles, Correspondence, Miscellaneous, and Artifacts.

The Activism series showcases Peg's involvement in York Area Lambda, as well as her participation in The Names Project: AIDS Memorial Quilt.

The bulk of this collection is the Newspaper Clippings Series, which is divided into nine sub-series: Aids Memorial Quilt in York, PA; Coverage of Gay Rights Debate in York, PA; Elizabethtown School District LGBT Issues; Ellen DeGeneres's Coming Out, Gay Marriage; Human Relations Commission of York, PA; York Area Lambda Library Display; York School District LGBT Issues; and General Topics. The clippings include both original physical newspapers and photocopies, with some of the copies containing multiple clippings.

The Magazine Articles cover Ellen DeGeneres's coming out, as well as national LGBTQ+ issues. The letters in the Correspondence series were all written by Peg (Stoppard) Welch to politicians, community leaders, and businesspeople, except one, which was written by Delma Welch. Miscellaneous items vary from local to national items, and the Artifacts collection includes a pen from the HerStory Bookstore in Wrightsville, PA.
