BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Robert "Bob" Deibler was born on January 20, 1940 in upper Paxton Township in Dauphin County, PA. He graduated from Millersburg Area High School and went on to attend Bloomsburg University with majors in social science and English. He later went on to teach English at Millersburg Area High School from 1961 to 1991, where he was also the musical director.

Besides teaching, Deibler was an active member in two men's clubs, the Pennsmen and the Satyr Men. After meeting his long-term partner, Ronn Fink, in 1985 and retiring from teaching in 1991, Deibler decided to move to Harrisburg, PA. While in Harrisburg, Deibler supported Fink in the running of the Bare Wall, a gift shop and video rental store and local landmark for the gay community in Harrisburg. Fink was diagnosed with bladder cancer and passed away two years after his diagnosis, at which time Deibler took over running the Bare Wall. After six months, he was unable to keep the Bare Wall running. He sold the business but stayed in Harrisburg.

Within this collection, the papers of Richard Schlegel are also included. Deibler and Schlegel where distant family relatives, with their mothers being first cousins. Deibler kept Schlegel's records for future reference.

Born in 1927 in Berrysburg, PA, a small borough in Dauphin County, Richard Schlegel grew up in various small towns in Pennsylvania. When he graduated from Pennsylvania State University in 1949, he moved to Washington, D.C. where is pursued a master's degree and later took a job in the federal government. However, his career ended in 1961 when he was fired for "immoral and indecent conduct" after being followed by secret investigators who investigated his personal life. Schlegel appealed his case, *Schlegel vs. the United States*, which went all the way to the U.S. Supreme Court but lost.

Schlegel then returned to Pennsylvania, and once back, sent his resume to the Governor's Office of Administration, Bureau of Personnel in Harrisburg. He was hired as Director of Finance for the Department of Highways (now referred to as Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, or PennDOT). Schlegel started a small chapter of the Janus Society in Harrisburg by recruiting a small membership and opening a post office box to communicate with the larger Janus Society in Philadelphia. This is believed to be the first gay organization created in central Pennsylvania. Yet, what happened in D.C. occurred again in Harrisburg, and Schlegel was fired from his state position in 1965 after a postal inspector told his state government superiors about the post office box. After this, Schlegel moved to Philadelphia. He later retired to his parents' home in Lewisburg, PA. He passed away February 26, 2006.

COLLECTION DESCRIPTION

The contents of this collection are broken into two series: Robert "Bob" Deibler and Richard Schlegel.

Robert "Bob" Deibler's papers include five categories: Bare Wall, Articles and Newspaper Clippings, Pennsmen, Media, and Artifacts. The Bare Wall category includes business cards for the Bare Wall and Ronn Fink. The Articles and Newspaper Clippings group includes articles about the Bare Wall, the Pennsmen, and an article authored by Fink. The Pennsmen series is comprised of event programs and photographs, with a focus on the Keystone Capital Run events. For preservation reasons the photographs have been removed from their original photo album and housed in photo sleeves. The photos are organized in the original order in which they appeared in the album. The Media series includes VHS tape recordings of the annual Mr. Harrisburg contest sponsored by The Pennsmen. Lastly, the Artifacts series is composed of Pennsmen and Satyr Men membership pins and a leather bracelet.

The Robert Schlegel papers include five categories: Employment, Articles and Newspaper Clippings, Certificates, Photos, Oral History, and Books. The Employment category contains information regarding Schlegel's time as a government employee in Washington D.C. and a copy of his case brief *Richard L. Schlegel vs. United States*. The Articles and Newspaper Clippings grouping includes coverage of Schlegel's time as the Director of Finance for the Department of Highways and his obituary. The Certificates category contains Schlegel's nomination into "Who's Who in America." The Photos section is comprised of images from Schlegel's time as Director of Finance for the Department of Highways. The Oral History category contains the transcription on an oral history interview recorded in 1993, and lastly the Book category contains a book that was dedicated to Schlegel.
