BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Gloria Jackie Schulze was born on November 25, 1934 in Huntington, WV. She graduated from high school and attended John Marshall University (now known as Marshall University) where she received her degree in Journalism. She met her then husband, George, during college, with whom she had Frederick (Rick) Schulze. The family moved around due to her husband's job, and finally relocated to the Harrisburg area in 1972. Jackie and her husband later divorced.

After her son Rick came out to her, Jackie attended a local Parents of Gays meeting, and then she, and Hope Nancarrow, local activist Mary Nancarrow's mother, established a local Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays (PFLAG) chapter. Founded in 1973, PFLAG is the largest LGBTQ+ organization for LGBTQ+ people, families, friends, and allies. Jackie was president of the local PFLAG chapter for 18 years, and during those years she regularly spoke at universities, schools, and churches. Jackie was also active in HIV/AIDS related activism alongside her son, Rick.

Jackie passed away in 2018.

Rick Schulze was born in Delaware in the early 1960s to Jackie Schulze and his father George. After moving around as a young child, Rick grew up primarily in the Harrisburg area. After high school, Rick went on to Mansfield University and was instrumental in forming The Mansfield Gay Alliance, the

first gay organization on campus. Rick also was active in HIV/AIDS awareness in Central PA, along with his mother, and worked closely with the organizations South Central AIDS Assistance Network (SCAAN) and AIDS Resource. Rick then went on to work with the Department of Health in HIV/AIDS Counseling during the 1990s. Rick is now in academia, eventually settling in as a professor in Health Education and Public Health at Lock Haven University.

Rick lives in the Lock Haven area today.

COLLECTION DESCRIPTION

This collection contains five series: Photographs, Correspondence, PFLAG, Miscellaneous, and Artifacts.

The Photograph series contains photos of Jackie and Rick, along with friends and family members. The Correspondence series is comprised of thank you notes and letters to Jackie pertaining to her activism. The PFLAG series contains a flyer for a PFLAG event and a newsletter issue. The Miscellaneous series contains a *Harrisburg Patriot-News* spread on AIDS in the Harrisburg area; religious hate mail; and information on Cindy Blush, the first AIDS patient to die in Harrisburg; and other miscellaneous items. Finally, the Artifact series is comprised of awards to Jackie, activist buttons from the 1980s, a framed appreciation letter to Jackie, and a PFLAG glass paper weight.
