### **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE**

Terrence Dragovan and Thomas F. Grubic were a married couple in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania. Thomas Grubic passed away in 2022. Grubic graduated from Bishop McDevitt High School in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania in 1967. Dragovan, a native of Steelton, Pennsylvania, also graduated from Bishop McDevitt High School and later Marshall University in 1984.

### **COLLECTION DESCRIPTION**

This collection contains two series: Artifacts and Books.

Series one contains seven artifacts from 1975-1995. These artifacts include matching pins from the 6<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Pennsmen and Pride Coalition of Central PA, drink tokens from the Neptune Lounge and a matchbook from La Rose Rouge, two LGBTQ+ bars in Harrisburg,

Pennsylvania.

Series two contains nine books published from 1988 to 1996 that feature topics relating to the LGBTQ+ community such as the artist Tom of Finland, the 1993 March on Washington for Lesbian, Gay, and Bi Equal Rights, the AIDS Memorial Quilt, LGBTQ+ icons, and advice for LGBTQ+ individuals.
