BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Don Haines was born in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, where he lived until the age of 12. He then moved to the suburbs of Lancaster, remaining in Lancaster County. Still within Lancaster County, Haines later moved to Columbia, Pennsylvania with his partner. Haines came out at the age of 23 in 1987, a time he described as a "very oppressive" time. Haines was raised Roman Catholic but struggled with the church's lack of acceptance, operating outside of the church until Pope Francis took charge. Haines graduated from Millersville University where he was a part of a gay and lesbian group. He worked for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, encouraged by Governor Schapp's acceptance of gay people and the protection of a union.

COLLECTION DESCRIPTION

This collection contains five series: Leather Community, Activism, Publications, Miscellaneous, and Artifacts.

The first series contains documents relating to the leather community in the Northeast. This includes newsletters circulated to community members, flyers promoting leather nights at bars, and a program from a leather pageant. The second series contains documents relating to LGBTQ+ activism. These documents feature the March on Washington for Lesbian, Gay, & Bi Equal Rights & Liberation in 1993 and the Lancaster AIDS Project. The third series focuses on publications and contains a letter and envelope from Ganymede Press, the publisher of DADDY the magazine as well as a copy of the *AU Courant* from July 1990. The fourth series is miscellaneous and contains a promotional condom and Unity Festival '91 invitation. The final series, Artifacts, contains a 1995 Central PA Pride button and a Pennsmen logo pin.
