INTERVIEW WITH SUZANNE WESTENHOEFER

I had an opportunity recently to interview Suzanne about her upcoming appearance at FAB November 22, 2003, and also to talk about other subjects.

LL: Are you looking forward to your appearance at FAB?

Suzanne: Yes! It's close to home, Columbia, and gives me a chance to see my family. My mom and the rest of the family come to my shows when I'm close to home.

LL: How was Women's Week in P'Town this year?

Suzanne: I love Women's Week, it was great! I was busy. I did 14 shows in 9 days, and every show was sold out. The other women performers were busy too. Usually we get a chance to hang out together and visit, but this year everyone was busy that week and we couldn't get together.

LL: Are you doing another Olivia Cruise soon?

Suzanne: Yes! In January I'll be on the Mexican Riviera cruise. They're a lot of fun. I do at least one a year.

LL: How many performances do you do a year?

Suzanne: I do anywhere from 80 to 100 shows a year. Last year I did 85.

LL: Have you ever thought about writing a book?

Suzanne: Everyone is after me to write a book, but I don't want to do it right now. Everybody's writing a book these days!

LL: Were you nervous about your appearance on Late Night with David Letterman back in March?

Suzanne: Oh yes, definitely. I was the first openly gay comic to appear there. I've never really been nervous about an appearance before, but this was different. I was the first and I didn't want to screw up. I had 4 minutes on stage, and it's like, ok, how do I open? How do I let them know I'm a lesbian? If I come right out and say it then it takes the audience 45 seconds to process that, and then I've only got 3 minutes left. I thought about it quite a bit, how do I let them know and keep their attention? So I started out....my girlfriend of 11 years and I....and went right into a joke about our living together. It went really well. It was quite an experience.

LL: What is your favorite charity?

Suzanne: Planned Parenthood. I'm very pro-choice.

LL: So what is a typical day like for you?

Suzanne: There is no typical day. Every day is something different. When I'm home, I wake up, worship Buddha, I'm a Buddhist, do my yoga, have breakfast, do some things around the house, and then do interviews in the afternoon.

LL: What do you want to be when you grow up?

Suzanne: Hmm. What I am now. I really enjoy what I'm doing. I have control over my career, I decide what I'm going to do, where I'm going, I'm the boss. I make a good living doing what I do, and I wouldn't want to change anything. I love doing stand-up comedy. This is what I want.

Health Spotlight....

LIVING WILLS

This subject has been in the news lately. I'm sure you all have read about that comatose Florida woman, Terri Schiavo, and the heated battle between her parents and her husband, over whether she should be allowed to die or not. If she had had a living will there would be no battle between her parents and her husband.

Everyone needs a living will. What is a living will? Basically it is a statement that is directed to medical personnel, which spells out the medical care you do or do not wish to receive if you become incapacitated. That means spelling out which life-prolonging procedures should be provided to you, or which life-prolonging procedures should be withheld.

Do you want the right to die with dignity? And without the tremendous agony and expense for you and your family caused by prolonging your life artificially? Then get yourself a living will.
