HATE CRIMES BILL INTRODUCED IN LEGISLATURE

Rep. Babette Josephs of Philadelphia, re-introduced, this year, the Bias Related Offenses Bill (BILL 1353). Bias related offences, (hate crimes) are committed because of an individual's race, color, religion, national origin, or sexual orientation. Current law does not cover sexual orientation, and it must be noted that PA. has the highest number of anti-Lesbian/Gay murders in the country." House Bill 1353 would include sexual orientation in the current hate crimes law.

GAY BOOKSTORE GETS BOMBED

On May fifth 1991, Nancy Helm opened The Closet bookstore on 25 N. Prince St. Lancaster. Early Monday morning, at one am on June 24, 1991, a bomb the strength of 1/2 stick of dynamite was taped to the window sill of the alcove of The Closet. It blew out two windows, part of a wall and the ceiling of the alcove. Because of the hour, no one was at the store.

K.K.K. TO MARCH IN LANCASTER

The K.K.K. has received a permit to have a march in Lancaster on August 24th. They are hoping for 30 to 100 people to march. They feel the need to counter-act the opening of The Closet bookstore and the recently passed Ordinance for Gay Rights in housing and employment in the city of Lancaster.

A counter march is being planned by those supporting the Gay community. Its plan is to be on the other side of the city to avoid any possibility of harm to anyone. If you are interested in being a part of, or watching the counter parade, call Nancy at 399-8818. You are encouraged to avoid the K.K.K. parade to de-emphasize its potential and avoid confrontation.

WITF choose not to show it. They felt the commu-

the film.

office. The general concessions was that the film
was beautifully done. The use of certain "offensive"
words was indeed woven into Riggs' poetry. The
story, however, had a power that surpassed the

Tuesday, May 14, the Lancaster City Council
amended the Human Rights Ordinance to include
protection from discrimination based on marital status
and sexual preference in areas of housing, educa-
tion, employment, and public accommodation. The
Mayor of Lancaster signed the measure into law.
Lancaster County, however is unwilling to support
enforcement of the ordinance. City Council and the
Mayor continue to back the ordinance as passed.

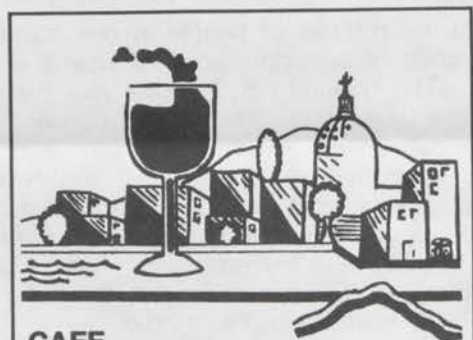
