

K.K.K. IN LANCASTER

A parade that lasted 14 minutes and cost the Lancaster taxpayers 30,000 dollars was the center of attention August 24 in the media and at the news stands. The parade by the KKK and counter parade by the group Unity on August 24, went on without the much feared violence predicted. Rumors were plentiful when the town became aware that the KKK was coming to march. People were encouraged to stay away from the march site.


The Unity coalition, a group of concerned churches and interested organizations in Lancaster, formed for an evening vigil on Aug. 23 at five of the churches, after which they walked to the square of Lancaster. Approx. 2,000 people

gathered for song, music and candle lighting.

An event was planned at the County Park to draw people away from the city. They started arriving at the park at 9:30 am to enjoy the music, pool, food vendors and t-shirt sales that was to begin at 11. A flow of people made the event a festival approximately 2,000 strong. The event was still going strong at the 3pm Rap contest.

Even with that, when 11am Sat. morning came in the city, the streets were filled to as much as 10 deep. The police appeared 300 strong in riot gear, many of whom removed badges, nametags and ties. Before the parade began two people were arrested. A KKK member who refused to be searched, (part of the agreement of the permit was that a search for weapons be made), and a man who shouted at the TV cameramen that they shouldn't be there. Of the 7 people arrested that day, none were Gay, two were Klan. The vocal crowd booed and yelled at the police as they went into the crowds to arrest.

The mood of the on-lookers was one of unity, and a strong sense of community prevailed throughout the parade. Many groups from out of town were in Lancaster to show their support. (Queer Nation of N.Y. was one) As the Klan moved down the street in rows of 6 they yelled slogans like "White Power" and "Fags got to go." The onlookers often drowned them out screaming back at them. When the parade ended, a counter march sprang and people filed spiritedly down the center of the S. Duke St. to walk to the County Park. In the end 36 Klansmen marched and 4,000 on-lookers.

ANOTHER BOMBING

At 2:23 AM , August 15, the Closet Bookstore in Lancaster was bombed for a second time. The front windows were shattered and window and door frames were damaged. Neither Nancy Helm, the owner, nor anyone else was harmed. A witness saw the two white males running from the store and driving away in a brown car.

The Police have termed the incident malicious mischief. While the Police were present, that night, a silver Chevrolet passed and three people shouted that they would do the next bomb "and get you fags." The Police termed this a terroristic threat. They are still investigating.

WOLFPACK

In the fall last year, a public defender was beaten up outside the Tally Ho Bar in downtown Lancaster. Several 17-22 year old youths were arrested. The public defender (who suffered a broken wrist) claims to have been coming from another bar (not gay). The youths' defense was that they hadn't meant to beat him up, but had meant to beat up gay people. It was considered malicious mischief. The case fell to a mistrial. A Hate Crimes Bill would make prosecution easier, and the penalty more severe. Several people have set up a Night Watch at the bar for safety.


