UNITY FESTIVAL CLOSES DOWN FOR A YEAR


Last July, the Third Unity Festival at Ski Roundtop drew several thousand participants who enjoyed themselves on the mountain and contributed to the cause of helping people with AIDS in Pennsylvania. Nikki Knerr, who founded and labored with this festival for three years felt it was a great success. Thousands of dollars were given to AIDS support groups, the entertainment was great, the food wonderful and the camraderie was there for us all.

The time came for renewing the contract with Ski Roundtop, and the answer was no. What had happened? The community had forgotten their manners and the owners of Roundtop made note. Men were seen entering and leaving wooded areas for inappropriate reasons; women were entwined for the public eye to see and cars were used as motel rooms. For most of us an incident or two of this nature can be overlooked as poor judgement, however Ski Roundtop took it seriously. The day after the festival the York Dispatch ran an article billing the Festival as a Gay gathering for AIDS.

These two factors made Ski Roundtop consider their image as a family resort. They made the decision that they could not lease the facility to us again.

The result has been that Nikki Knerr has not been able to find another facility that would hold the Festival. She has all intentions of running it again next year, and hopes to be very clear about the standards that will allow us all to be able to get our resources together to make a strike against AIDS.

Anyone wishing to contribute to the fight against AIDS may send a donation of what they would have spent at the Unity festival to your local AIDS support group.






