





THE LAW AND YOU



My friend wants me to co-sign on a loan for her. She said that I would have no responsibility to re-pay the loan. I have an excellent credit his-

tory, but my friend has terrible credit. She is really a good friend and I don't believe she would do me wrong. Should I be a co-signer for her?

A: As a general guideline, it is NOT advisable to co-sign on a loan (or any other legal monetary obligation, such as a lease.) If a person is creditworthy, a lender will not usually require a co-signer. When a person seeks a cosigner, it is usually because that person has a bad credit history. Sometimes, a co-signer is needed when an individual is young and has not yet established any credit history. Whatever the particular circumstances, you can be sure that the lender has a concern about whether the person borrowing the money will re-pay the loan as promised. The lender wants to protect itself -- so it asks the person to find a co-signer. Remember that the lender is in the business of extending credit to people and that the lender probably has huge financial resources to off-set any losses it may experience.


On the other hand, you are probably a working person who could be seriously hurt if you had to suffer a financial loss. That is exactly why you should use extreme caution before you agree to co-sign for another person. Even though your friend sincerely believes that she will repay the loan and that you will not be responsible for any payments, you must be careful. The lender of the money can (and most certainly will) look to you for any payments that your friend does not make on time.

It does not matter why your friend cannot make her payments. Your co-signature on the loan acts to guarantee the lender that YOU will be responsible for making all of the payments. Sometimes, situations occur that no-one anticipated. Your friend could become seriously ill and unable to work. She never intended to hurt you financially -- yet, she finds herself in a position where she cannot possibly make the payments herself. It would be too late at that point for her to say she relieves you of any responsibility. Once you have co-signed, the only way you are relieved of any obligation is if your friend completely pays off the loan.

Bottom line is.....be very careful about co-signing for anyone. You could end up with an expensive debt to repay. Even worse, your own credit (along with your friendship) may become tarnished.
