THE LAW AND YOU

Q: We are confused about the difference between a Will and a Living Will. Are they the same thing? Do non-traditional couples need either of them?

A: In a previous column, the need for a Health Care Surrogate was discussed. That legal document is utilized when an individual is physically or mentally incapable of making health care decisions for herself. A Health Care Surrogate may be needed in a temporary situation, not necessarily a situation where death is approaching. This reader questions two other legal documents. Because they are two separate and distinct types of legal documents, we will consider only a Living Will in this column. Next time, we will discuss a Will (also called a Last Will and Testament).

The term "Living Will" is somewhat misleading. Most people think of a Will as taking effect only after a death has occurred. A Living Will is effective while a person is still alive. Sometimes, a Living Will is referred to as an "Advanced Directive" and whichever term is used, this legal document is a powerful way for any person to speak for herself when she is unable to communicate in the normal fashion about life-prolonging measures.

The Living Will (or Advanced Directive) is specifically designed to address one special aspect of medical care. Many people believe in a right to die and that it would be inappropriate for medical science to prolong anyone's suffering. The issue then becomes how does one make her beliefs known, just in case she is unable to speak for herself. Victims of a severe stroke or heart attack may be prevented from speaking. Motor vehicle accidents may result in brain damage, a comatose state, or other serious injuries that cause a person to be described as a "vegetable." When these types of unexpected events occur, medical personnel cannot ask the patient: "What are your wishes under these circumstances?" The Living Will provides the direction to be taken in advance of the situation actually occurring. Thus, it is commonly called an Advanced Directive.

It is important to know that as long as a person has the ability to communicate for herself, no-one will look to a Living Will for any answers. However, it may be of importance for any individual to prepare a Living Will. This is a matter of personalized preference. Regardless of anyone's age, sexual orientation, or relationship status, this issue should be considered. Some people are adamant in saying: "I would never want to be kept alive on some machine; to me, that is not living." From a legal standpoint, it is important to put that statement into legal form by way of a Living Will. Just saying the words is not sufficient.

A Living Will simply provides that no extraordinary means are to be taken when a person is terminally ill or in a permanent state of unconsciousness. People who prepare a Living Will are indicating a commitment to refuse life-sustaining treatment under certain circumstances. In other words, let nature do its course without any interference from medical science.

The Living Will must be properly prepared and signed in front of impartial witnesses. It is a short document and it can be revoked at any time. Any readers who are considering the preparation of a Living Will may wish to call Choice in Dying, Inc. at 1-800-989-9455. This non-profit organization advocates the rights of patients to receive compassionate and dignified care at the end of life. Appropriate forms will be provided, along with information as to how to complete the Living Will and what to do with it after completion.




