### A NOTABLE WOMAN OF COLOR

### RUTH ELLIS

#### 1899 - 2000

For many, many years this woman had been a role model with the Detroit gay community. She was considered a national treasure among the LGBT community. She was known as much for her energy as for her deep committment to human rights. Noted author Alice Walker called her "a woman of power, audacity, and joy."

She was profiled in an award-winning documentary by Yvonne Welbon titled "Living With Pride: Ruth Ellis @ 100." She was the subject of numerous articles and received many honors during her life. The LGBT center in Detroit was named the Ruth Ellis Center.

Despite being only 4 feet, 8 inches tall, and weighing only 83 pounds, this woman was an enourmouse presence in the lives of those who knew her. She brought together people of all races, ages and sexual orientation. She loved everyone. She was quite an inspiration to younger lesbians in Detroit.

She was born and raised in Springfield, Illinois. She was one of the few African-American women in her community to graduate from high school. Her brother convinced her to move to Detroit where the wages were better. After moving to Detroit in 1937, she met Ceceline (Babe) Franklin, her partner for the next 34 years. They bought a house togeth and ran a successful print shop in Detroit. Ruth never hid her sexuality, making her a role model for younger people who struggled with self-acceptance.

She loved social gatherings, and regularly attended the Michigan

Womyn's Festival. She never stopped helping others despite her age and declining health. She died in her sleep at the age of 101. A truly remarkable woman!

### UNDERSTANDING DIVERSIFICATION

(Provided by AIM Mutual Funds & Janney Montgomery Scott, LLC)

Diversification, in the simplest terms, means that you don't put all of your eggs in one basket. Investors who watched their tech-heavy portfolios contract since 2000 discovered the painfully clear wisdom behind diversification. Investing heavily in the latest hot growth area may not be the best strategy.

One of the primary goals of diversification is to reduce the risks that can plague a concentrated portfolio. By investing across different asset classes, such as stocks, bonds and cash (as well as different sectors within those asset classes), a portfolio may be better positioned to withstand a downtum that affects just one area of the investing universe. The reverse is also true: if one area rallies, a diversified portfolio is better positioned to take advantage of the growth. Ideally, you want your portfolio's components to complement each other by offsetting downturns in one area with gains in another. This is known as a low correlation; the desired result is that when one portion of your portfolio zigs, another zags. So when stocks suffer a down year, bonds may outperform. When large-cap stocks plateau, small-cap stocks may rally. Since no one can accurately predict which type of investment will outperform when, a diversified approach makes the most sense.


