AIR CONDITIONER MAINTENANCE

The summer months are approachingfast, and with it comes heat (hopefully), and thoughts of air conditioning your home. If you use window air conditioning units, please be sure to check your filter, located on the front panel, from time to time to see if it needs cleaned. These filters do get dirty! You can wash it in your kitchen sink in warm sudsy water, rinse well, pat dry, and put it back in your air conditioner. If you have pets, I suggest checking these filters once a week or every other week. A dirty filter reduces the efficiency of your air conditioning unit, making it work harder and using more electricity.

With central air units, the filter is located somewhere along the return duct's length. For more information on how to make your air conditioning system more energy efficient, please check this website: www.eere.energy.gov/erec/factsheets/aircond.html.

Health Spotlight....

ARE YOU DRINKING ENOUGH WATER?

I bet you're not! I know I'm not! The latest study from researchers at the University of Utah In Salt Lake City concludes that drinking eight 8 oz. glasses of water a day is still the thing to do. They have found that if you don't drink enough water, the greatest effect may not be physical - but mental and emotional. You are probably saying - what?

If you drink half the recommended amount of water, you'll probably suffer from mild dehydration. You'll have less energy, and you won't be able to concentrate and focus as you normally would. If you exercise and sweat a lot, you'll need more than eight 8 oz. glasses of water per day to properly hydrate your body.

Our bodies need water because water makes up more than 70 percent of solid body tissue. It also helps regulate body temperature, carries nutrients and oxygen to cells, removes waste from our bodies, cushions joints, and protects organs and tissues. If you drink too little water each day, it can cause headaches, grogginess, and dry, itchy skin. When we become severly dehydrated, it affects our blood pressure, circulation, digestion, kidney function, and nearly all body processes.

If you are outside a lot in the summer for activities like softball, jogging, golfing, swimming, lying on the beach catching some rays, walking, gardening, exercising or what-have-you, make sure you keep hydrated. Drink lots of water!
