Health Spotlight....

CAREGIVER STRESS

First question....what is a caregiver? A caregiver is someone who is caring for another person, a friend or relative, who has health problems or disabilities and need help. Most people who need help are elderly. About one fourth of American families are caring for an older family member, an adult child with disabilities, or a friend. Studies have shown that more than half of the caregivers are women. Care receivers are about half women and half men.

Next question...what exactly is caregiver stress? Caregiving often takes a lot of time, effort and work. Many caregivers struggle to balance caregiving with other responsibilities including full-time jobs and caring for children. Constant stress can lead to "burnout" and health problems for the caregiver. Caregivers may feel guilty, frustrated, and angry from time to time. Caregivers often need help in caring for the elderly or disabled care receiver. Sometimes there are others around to help, but many of the caregivers do most or all of the caregiving alone. Research has shown that caregivers are at increased risk for depression and illness.

What can a caregiver do to prevent stress and burnout? First of all, you must ask for help. It's never easy to ask for help, but getting help from others will help you and the person you are caring for. You have to take care of you. Make sure you are eating right and taking vitamins. You need to make sure you are getting enough sleep and rest. Exercise. Regular exercise can help reduce stress. See your doctor for a checkup. Talk to your doctor about symptoms of depression or illness that you may be having. Get counseling if needed, it really helps. Find a support group for other caregivers in your situation. Many support groups are available online through the internet.

What other options do I have? Check with your local Area Agency on Aging and talk to them about your situation and what resources are available to help you and the care receiver. You can also call the National Eldercare Locator, it's toll-free, at 1-800-677-1116. Operators are available M-F, 9 AM-8 PM. The Eldercare Locator is also available online at: www.eldercare.gov. You can't do it alone, get the help you need.
