Ms. Kleen sez....

Let's talk about dish washers, not the human kind. Did you know that if the water entering the dishwasher is hotter than 140 F, you run the risk of permanently etching the glasses and flatware? If the water is cooler than 140 F, you'll have disappointing results. How does one check the water temperature? Fill a container with the hottest water from your tap. Check the temperature with a meat thermometer then adjust your water heater so that your hottest water is about 140 F.

Best dishwashing detergent? It's difficult to beat Cascade's line of products, but Wal-Mart's and Costco's store brands come pretty close. Don't rinse those dishes off before you put them in the dishwasher! The dishwasher detergent is highly alkaline and needs the acidity of the food to reach optimum cleaning action. Besides, rinsing wastes time, water and energy.

I learned that using more detergent is not better. Using more detergent than required may permanently etch your glasses and flatware. You can go to your water company's web site and click on water quality, or make a phone call. You need to know what the hardness rating of your water in "grains per gallon" or gpg. You need only 1 to 4 tablespoons, depending on the hardness of your water. 0 to 3 grains hardness, 1 Tbsp; 4 to 6 grains, 2 Tbsp; 7 to 9 grains, 3 Tbsp; and 10 to 12 grains, 4 Tbsp.

Using the dishwasher actually saves water compared to washing by hand. It takes 6 - 10 gallons of water to run the dishwasher, and doing them by hand consumes 9 - 24 gallons of water. Dishwasher wins!




