

MEN'S HONOREE RUSS MUELLER

Russ is the pastor at St. Michael Lutheran Church on State St. in Harrisburg. Russ has been a friend to the LGBTQ community in Harrisburg for a long time. BiGlyah, later to become Common Roads had it's start there. Russ became active in the group's weekly meetings. He was an oddity for some of the youth, a pastor who supported rather than condemned them. He has been sean often at LGBT rallies and has participated with SPARC. He was willing to attend events to learn. He helped staff the church's table at PrideFest, which sought to help people find religious organizations that were gay-friendly. Russ has continued as a facilitator with Common Roads and serves on the Board of Common Roads.

St. Mike's has been regarded as "gay friendly" for over two decades. Russ supported the leaders as they led the congregation to adopt a statement of welcome. Part of the statement specifically welcomed all who were LGBT. It became obvious that the congragation was, in fact, a "Reconciling in Christ" congregation (an organization of Lutheran churches that were assertive in their support of the LGBT community.) St. Mike's formally joined and is the only (RIC) Lutheran congregation in 50 miles. His candor and his actions have encouraged other pastors and leaders to seek him out as they strive to grow in this matter.



Health Spotlight....

NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS

Everybody makes New Year's Resolutions. Have you kept with them for a whole year? Chances are, you probably haven't. Don't worry, most of us haven't either, so you have LOTS of company.

The problem with trying to stick with our resolutions comes down to....did we make REALISTIC resolutions? We all need to make them easy, and take it in baby steps. Ok, you say you want to exercise more. Don't join that gym just yet. Start out by doing some simple exercises at home first, then add walking, and then later you can join that gym if you feel that you will stick with it.

Want to quit smoking? Check with your doctor first. Your doctor will probably know which of those smoking cessation patches and programs works best. Maybe hypnosis interests you, check with a therapist who is knowledgeable in that area.

Thinking about losing weight? Again, check with your doctor, he/she will know which programs work best.
