

Health Spotlight...

DO YOU HAVE IRON POOR BLOOD?

Did you know that iron deficiency is the number one deficiency in women and the leading cause of fatigue in women between the ages of 15 and 50?

A shortage of iron in the blood deprives cells of the oxygen they require to burn the body's fuel. Even a mild deficiency can rob you of energy and leave you feeling constantly tired or even exhausted. Your concentration may become so impaired that you find it difficult to complete simple tasks. Even a mild deficiency can be linked to PMS, depression, impaired fertility and pregnancy complications.

Some symptoms of iron deficiency can include: Pale skin; increased susceptibility to infections such as colds and flu; pale dark circles under the eyes; fatigue and weakness; poor sleep; cold hands and feet.

You need to get sufficient iron in your diet. Good dietary sources of iron are: lean meats, fish and poultry; and plant foods, which includes beans, tofu, raisins, leafy dark green vegetables, spinach, etc.

If you engage in regular intense exercise you will require more iron. If you are a vegetarian, you may need to take in twice as much iron as meat eaters because of the lower intestinal absorption of iron from plant foods. If you don't take in enough iron through diet alone, you may need to consider taking iron supplements.


