





Health Spotlight.

HEALTH PERILS OF GUM DISEASE

Gum disease has been linked with heart disease, diabetes, lung problems, and premature and low-birth-weight babies. With bulimics (people who induce vomiting), a dentist can see the acid wearing away the inner surface of their teeth. Osteoporosis can be seen in dental X-rays.

Most people worry about cavities, but periodontal disease can also be a big problem for people with poor oral hygiene. Gum disease is an infection of the tissues supporting the teeth. When plaque develops, bacteria irritate the gums and cause them to swell. Int the beginning, the disease is called gingivitis and nly affects the gums. In more advanced phases, the disease is known as periodontitis. The bacteria goes under the gum line, eventually attacking the tissues and bone around the teeth. This can lead to tooth loss.

Besides poor oral hygiene, other factors can raise the risk of periodontal disease: smoking - genetics - stress - medication use - poor nutrition - diabetes - pregnancy - crooked teeth - defective fillings - clenching or grinding teeth. Regular dental check-ups can help detect, prevent and treat gum disease and the disorders that go with it.

Periodental bacteria can also enter the bloodstream, and can thicken the walls of the arteries, which is an early sign of hardening of the arteries, which can lead to heart problems, such as heart attacks. The presence of bacteria in elevated levels causes inflammation in the bloodstream. Inflamed arteries and blood clots are hallmarks of heart disease. People with gum disease are twice as likely to have coronary artery disease, compared to people without gum disease.

What can you do? Brush your teeth twice a day, floss your teeth daily, eat a balanced mix of foods and limit between-meal snacks, and visit your dentist regularly for professional cleanings and oral exams. Also, avoid sharing toothbrushes and change brushes often.
