## Mz. Kleen sez....

Let's go into your bathroom and take a look at your tub and shower stall (whichever you have). You see those ugly-looking spots on your glass doors or shower walls? That comes from the alkaline in your water.

Clean your doors/shower walls to get those spots off. Next, apply car wax to the walls and doors. Yes, car wax. I know, it sounds funny, but it works. Both fiberglass and glass are porous materials. The car wax seals those pores, which makes cleaning easier and keeps water spots away. Do this twice a year. Do not wax the bathtub/shower stall floor. That could be dangerous to your health.

It's recommended that you squeegee or wipe down your shower after each use to prevent buildup. If you're tired of fighting soap scum buildup, switch to a liquid soap, natural soap or Dove. It's the talc in most bar soaps that causes that buildup. You still need to clean the shower once a week, but your job will be easier.







## Health Spotlight.

#### UNDIAGNOSED CORONARY SYNDROME

In as many as 3 million US women with coronary artery disease, cholestral plaque may not build up into major blockages, like it does in men, but instead spreads evenly throughout the artery wall. As a result, diagnostic coronary angiography reveals that these women have "clear" arteries - no blockages - incorrectly indicating low risk. Despit this, many of these women have a high risk for heart attack, according to newly published research from the National Institutes of Health.

In women with this condition, called coronary microvascular syndrome, plaque accumulates in very small arteries of the heart, causing narrowing, reduced oxygen flow to the heart, and pain that can be similar to that of people with blocked arteries, but the plaque does not show up when doctors use standard tests. As a result, many women go undiagnosed, they are not treated for their angina and high cholestral and they remain at high risk for having a heart attack.

The majority of women with "clear" angiography who are not diagnosed will continue to have symptoms, a declining quality of life, and repeated hospitalizations and tests.

To accurately detect heart disease, women may require different tests to see how smaller coronary arteries respond to stress. They include cardiac MRIs, stress echocardiograms and micro heart catheterization.
