Did you know that gay, lesbian, bisexual transgender and questioning youth are more at risk in our schools than their straight peers?

They are 3 times more likely to attempt suicide - It is estimated that they account for 30% of all youth suicides - They are rejected by their families more than a quarter of the time - The majority report that they are subjected to harassment by their peers verbally and physically.

Students are clarifying their sexual/affectional orientation earlier and earlier. They are doing it while negotiating a school culture that is usually hostile to students who identify as LGBTQ. In this workshop educators will acquire background information, knowledge of current laws and policies and recommended practices for helping LGBTQ as learners within this context.

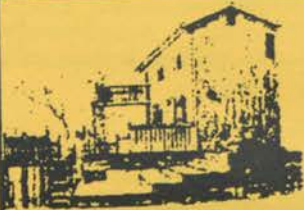

Health Spotlight....

GUM DISEASE

That it can contribute to respiratory disease? That it also plays a role in osteoporosis? And that it can severely stress the immune system and can lower resistance to other infections? That it can reduce your life expectancy?

The good news is that in most people gum disease is preventable. Attention to everyday oral hygiene (brushing & flossing), coupled with professional cleanings twice a year, could be all that's needed to prevent gum disease - and actually reverse the early stage, and help you keep your teeth for a lifetime.
