FREEDOM GROWS!

Hello. Last month we hit you with the first issue of FREEDOM-the newsletter of the Lancaster
Parish of MCC-Harrisburg. This
month, as a pilot project, this
issue--the second issue of
FREEDOM--covers not only the
Lancaster Parish, but Harrisburg as
well. It is co-produced by MCCHarrisburg and the Lancaster Parish.

We have agreed to this pilot project for this month, and I imagine that we will extend it into the next month or two before we make a final decision as to whether to continue publishing one newsletter for the two separate churches. In any case, I hope you like it.

This was an exciting month in Lancaster because it was the first month with our new schedule of two worship services, rather than just one. It did mean that I had to prepare two sermons within a short period of time, and that was a new thing for me, but I managed.

The whole concept of being a preacher is something that I really had not come to grips with before now. Not that I have fully come to grips with it now, but I am realizing an importance to preaching that up to now I had been overlooking.

The Lancaster congregation has been very patient with me while I have been trying out my wings (so to speak) and exploring whole new areas of my ministry. For this I am very grateful, and I offer you my thanks.

However, there is more to church leadership than the Co-Worship Coordinator. It requires the concerted effort of all of us to make this church work. At our last worship service, I passed around a piece of paper whereon people could put their names if they wanted to help out with the worship service.

If you missed that service but would like to help out, just give me a call (392-2729) and I'll be glad to find something that you can do. In like manner, there are other jobs that need to be done. We always need help with the newsletter. And there is always some project that you can plug in to. For example, I am still looking for someone to coordinate the bus trip to Washington, D.C. on June 20, 1982 for Gay Pride Day. Are you that person?

And speaking of projects, probably our biggest project to date is coming up this summer. It is an evangelism and outreach program that is bigger than anything we have ever attempted. And it involves, mainly, coming out of our closets—not the closets we live in as Gay and Lesbian people (although that is worthy of consideration), but the closets we live in as Christians.

Our Lord has promised that we shall know the truth and the truth shall make us free. It is not enough to bask in the glory of our own freedom. The time is coming to free those around us. People who live in shame, fear, doubt and despair are captives. By spreading God's Good News we can help to set them free. Come to the meeting on May 23, 1982 to see what it is all about.

In the meantime, enjoy your FREEDOM and share it!
