"FREEDOM" Continues --But What of "The Link"????

Herewith and herein and right in your hand is the third big issue of FREEDOM. Once again we are combining the efforts of MCC-Harrisburg with the Lancaster Parish to publish this opus.

But what, oh what, has become of "The Link"--the gay newspaper serving central Pennsylvania that what sponsored by MCC-Harrisburg? Well, truthfully, we don't know. There has been a breakdown in communications between the editor of that paper and the Board of the Harrisburg church.

Because of this, and because of the responsibility that MCC-Harrisburg feels for that paper, the Board took some actions at

the meeting last Friday.

First, we affirmed that we still support the idea or concept of a newspaper serving the gay community in central Pennsylvania. However, since we have no idea if or when the next issue of "The Link" will come out, we have decided to refund the subscription money to all those subscribers who request such a refund in writing. In like manner, any advertisor whose paid ad did not appear in print will receive a refund if they request one in writing. We will continue these refunds until the money in the "Link" fund runs out.

And lastly, we have a board meeting on June 25, 1982. If it appears at that time that there is to be no further communication with the "Link," our intent is to vote to discontinue our relationship with that paper.

As far as FREEDOM goes, the Board voted to continue publishing it as a joint venture for the next two months.

In other action, the Board voted to sponsor a bus trip from MCC-Harrisburg to Atlantic City in August. The tickets will be about \$16, and the success of the trip depends on support by the community. See the calendar for the date and times involved.

And speaking of busses, it looks like the Lancaster bus trip to Gay Pride Day in Washington, DC actually will take place!!! A committee has been formed and is making the plans as we go to press. More details may be found in later

pages of this very paper.

And speaking of busses, the Dignity/CP annual bus trip to Gay Pride Day in New York City is on once again, this year on June 27. Because of the extensive participation of the Harrisburg church, MCC-Harrisburg and the Lancaster parish will hold joint services that day in Lancaster at the Unitarian center. Mark your calendars!

As many of you know by now, I was involved in a minor auto accident on May 16. Although I am still very sore, I am healing very nicely, thank you. Thank you also for all your prayers. They

really helped.

I was very happy to be able (finally) to share my "Bunch of Baloney" sermon with MCC-Hbg, last Sunday. That's the one that inspired the name of this newsletter. Freedom is our birthright as God's children. Enjoy your FREEDOM!

### WHAT'S OVER THE RAINBOW? by Al Johnson

Since moving to Lancaster, I lost what was over the rainbow. I'm living in a city with gay people but no gay community.

You may ask what was over the rainbow. I hoped I'd find a community of gay people working together to bring about community services of interest to gays since they weren't provided by straight society.

I needed those outlets for a sense of purpose--betterment. I needed them to educate myself as a gay man who was still learning what the gay world has to offer, and in turn, what I can give the gay world and society in which I live.

I began to read about the minority to which I belong--about which most gay folks don't care one way or the other. I felt that somewhere over the rainbow I would no longer be completely ignorant of the life-

style I was living.

I needed to know that there was life after the bars, cruising, and book stores like in Baltimore where I used to live. I found this in the newly emerging services provided by the gay community 12 years ago. These excited me as I was just coming out. I was surprised that we were beginning to have gay rap groups, hot-lines, churches, dances, educational book stores, literary forums, youth groups, over-40 groups and many other opportunities for me to participate in.

I thank God every day for that community for it helped me deal with my gayness since

We gays here in Lancaster are in the beginning stages of forming a much needed community. Don't turn your back on what this community will have to offer without checking it out first.

We all can't move to the "bigger rainbows" of Philadelphia, D.C., New York, etc., so let's make our rainbows here. Everyone's

help is needed.
