Several people have ask, so we are sure more of you have wondered why you hav'nt gotten anything from the church in the mail. The energy that went into an MCC newsletter has been used for the community newspaper The Link. Most of you have received at least one copy in the mail, although some were overlooked in the first mailing as we tried to distribute as many as possible by hand since we had not been able to complete the work necessary to get our bulk rate mailing permit in time to mail the first

issue, but did use it for the second.

Because there was little interest in producing our own newsletter at the time, it was felt that we could temporarily stop putting out a monthly newsletter and support a community paper that would carry most of our news and for a much lower cost per person effectively reach as many as ten times the people we were reaching in a newsletter sent first class mail to a hundred people. The Link is being published, although somewhat irregularly, and can use your help in any way. As subscriptions and ads continue to come in, it will become more stable. The introductory \$5.00 per year subscription offer ends April 1, with the price going to \$10.00. Send your check or money order to The Link,

Now, what about an MCC newsletter? We realize that a regular newsletter directed to those with expressed interest in MCC is an effective ministry and now that we have a bulk rate mailing permit you will probably hear from us more often. Some of the things to be considered include: the number of people and quality of help available, expressed concern about a newsletter and response to this one, the time when a clergyperson will be in Harrisburg and their time available and interest in a newsletter, the possibility of temporarily combining our newsletter with Lancaster's, and for the present time the need to communicate more directly with those people who have expressed interest in MCC as opposed to the larger readership of the newspaper.
