Every now and then a comedy comes along with a heart so big and a cast of characters so wonderfully bizarre that you cannot help but fall in love with it - while crying with laughter. The Iron Ladies is absolutely one of those films. A true story, it describes a volleyball team's inexorable march of transsexuals, transvestites and some rather effeminate gay guys to the Thai male national championships in 1996. At the team's heart are Mon, a weary transvestite, unlucky in love, and a fantastic player, and his best friend Jun, a raucous drag queen with hilariously over-supportive parents. (1hr, 44mins)

In a rare on-screen appearance, Kelly McGillis (The Accused, Witness and Tom Cruise's lover in Top Gun) stars in her most provocative and daring role to date as a bisexual married woman drawn into a torrid lesbian love affair with a private investigator searching for the murderer of a young woman. Susie Porter, last seen in Better Than Sex, plays the private eye who willingly, at first, dives into a world of murder and manipulation, only to be consumed by the ever-enthraling power of sex. Suspenseful, hard-edged and entirely lustful, The Monkey's Mask is a smoldering story of two star-crossed lovers whose lives will never be the same. (1hr, 20mins)

With chiseled chests, throbbing music, and designer drugs, this film takes a non-stop tour of the circuit party scene, from the first beating dance mix to the morning-after withdrawal. John, a naïve, small-town cop arrives in West Hollywood, and he's quickly caught up in the circuit world, leaving his job to manhandle customers as the bouncer at a gay club. The filmmaker's steamy homage to the glamour and glistening flesh of the circuit scene comes with a warning label attached: men who party this hard also party at their own risk. (2hrs)

Burnt Money

Burnt Money premiered at the 2000 Toronto International Film Festival and is set in 1965 Argentina by director Marcelo Piñeyro. This true story follows the tumultuous, steamy relationship between two men who became lovers and ultimately ruthless bank robbers. Nene (Leonardo Sbaraglia), Angel (Eduardo Noriega) and Cuervo (Pablo Echarr) are bank robbers who flee Argentina to Uruguay after a large-scale hold-up turns bloody. Angel is hurt and the three must lay low until Angel recovers. Nene and Angel are known to everyone they know as "the twins" because of their resemblance, but the two are not brothers at all - they are involved in a steamy homosexual relationship. Eventually, with police in pursuit, the fate of Nene and Angel appears to be sealed. (2 hrs.)

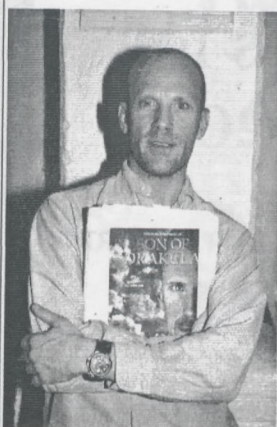

**Filmmaker's Reception: "The Night Larry Kramer Kissed Me"
with guest appearance by DAVID DRAKE**



Writer/Performer David Drake won a Village Voice Obie Award for his debut play - and now a movie kicking off central PA's 1st Annual Gay & Lesbian Film Festival - *The Night Larry Kramer Kissed Me*. Following a year-long run in New York, Mr. Drake toured the show internationally: London, Manchester, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Sydney, Melbourne, San Francisco, and Los Angeles, where he won two L.A. Dramalogue Awards and a *Frontiers Magazine* Robbie Award. To date, *The Night Larry Kramer Kissed Me* has received nearly 100 independent productions in ten countries, including South Africa, New Zealand, China, Canada, and is currently playing in Brazil.

More recently, Drake starred in the Off-Broadway revival of *The Boys in the Band*, and co-starred with B.D. Wong in *A Language of Their Own* at the Public Theater. Feature film appearances include: Philadelphia, *Naked* in New York, *It's Pat*, *Longtime Companion*, *David Searching*, *Hit and Runway*, and stars with Ann Cusack in *Peoria Babylon*. Mr. Drake has also appeared in a dozen short films, including international festival favorites *Cater-Waiter*, *The Trey Billings Show*, and Lisa Collins' Academy Award-winning *Tree Shade*.



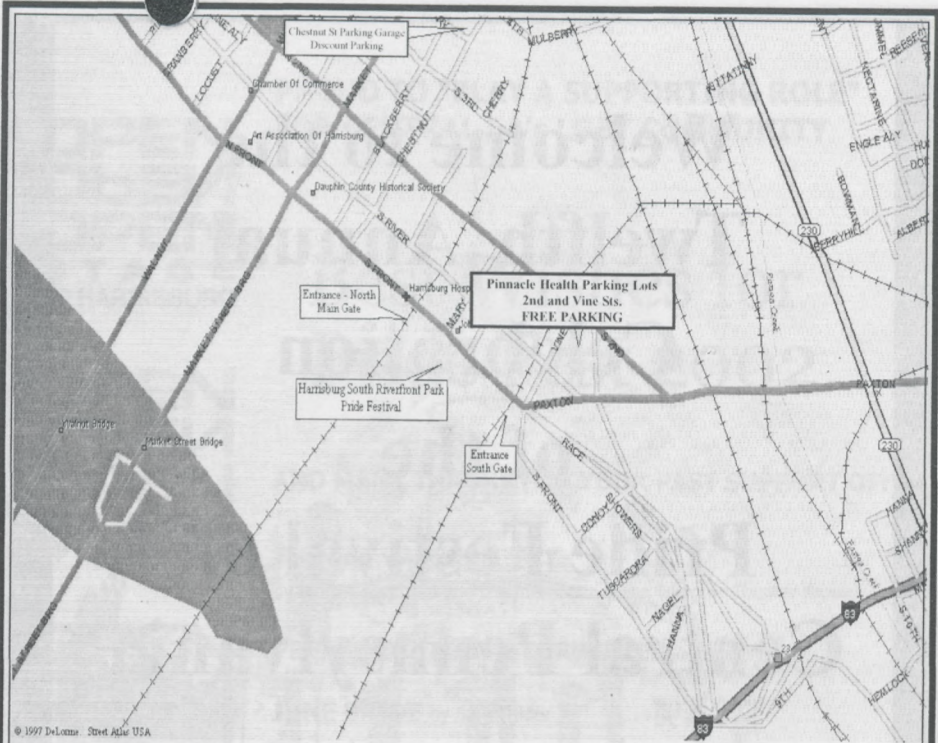




Welcome to the Twelfth Annual Celebration of the Pride Festival of Central Pennsylvania

PrideFest commemorates the Stonewall Rebellion in June 1969, then the gay community fought police after they raided the Stonewall Bar. Subsequently, this date is remembered across the US in virtually every major city. Across the globe, it is estimated that approximately 16-20 million people celebrate Pride commemorating their own gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgendered movement.



How to get here from there

From NJ/Philadelphia/Lancaster: PA Turnpike west to I-283/PA-283 exit, exit number 19, towards HARRISBURG/HERSHEY. Merge onto I-283 N. Stay straight to go onto I-83 S. Take I-83 South (Harrisburg) to Exit 43-Capital/Second St and follow to the traffic light at Chestnut St. Turn left onto Chestnut St. and follow to traffic light(South Front St).

From Pittsburgh: PA Turnpike east to I-283/PA-283 exit, exit number 19, towards HARRISBURG/HERSHEY. Merge onto I-283 N. Stay straight to go onto I-83 S. Take I-83 South (Harrisburg) to Exit 43-Second St and follow to the traffic light at Chestnut St. Turn left onto Chestnut St. and follow to traffic light(South Front St).

From Baltimore/York: Merge onto I-83 North. Take Exit 43 to Capital/Second St and follow to the traffic light at Chestnut St. St. Turn left onto Chestnut St. and follow to traffic light(South Front St).

From I-81: Take the Front St. Exit and follow south along Riverfront (Susquehanna River). The festival site is beyond Market St.

Where to Park

Parking is available at either the Walnut St. and Chestnut St. Garages. The Chestnut St. Garage is located at 4th and Chestnut Sts. The Walnut St. Garage is located on Walnut St (between 2nd and 3rd Sts., and behind the Whitaker Center/Hilton Hotel).

We request that you DO NOT PARK in the Harrisburg Hospital/Pinnacle parking garage.

Open parking lots are available for FREE parking in the Pinnacle Health open parking lot, located in the 2nd and Vine Sts. area.

Parking is available on City Island. Parking fee may apply.

Handicapped parking is located at the South Gate entrance.

Gate Entrance

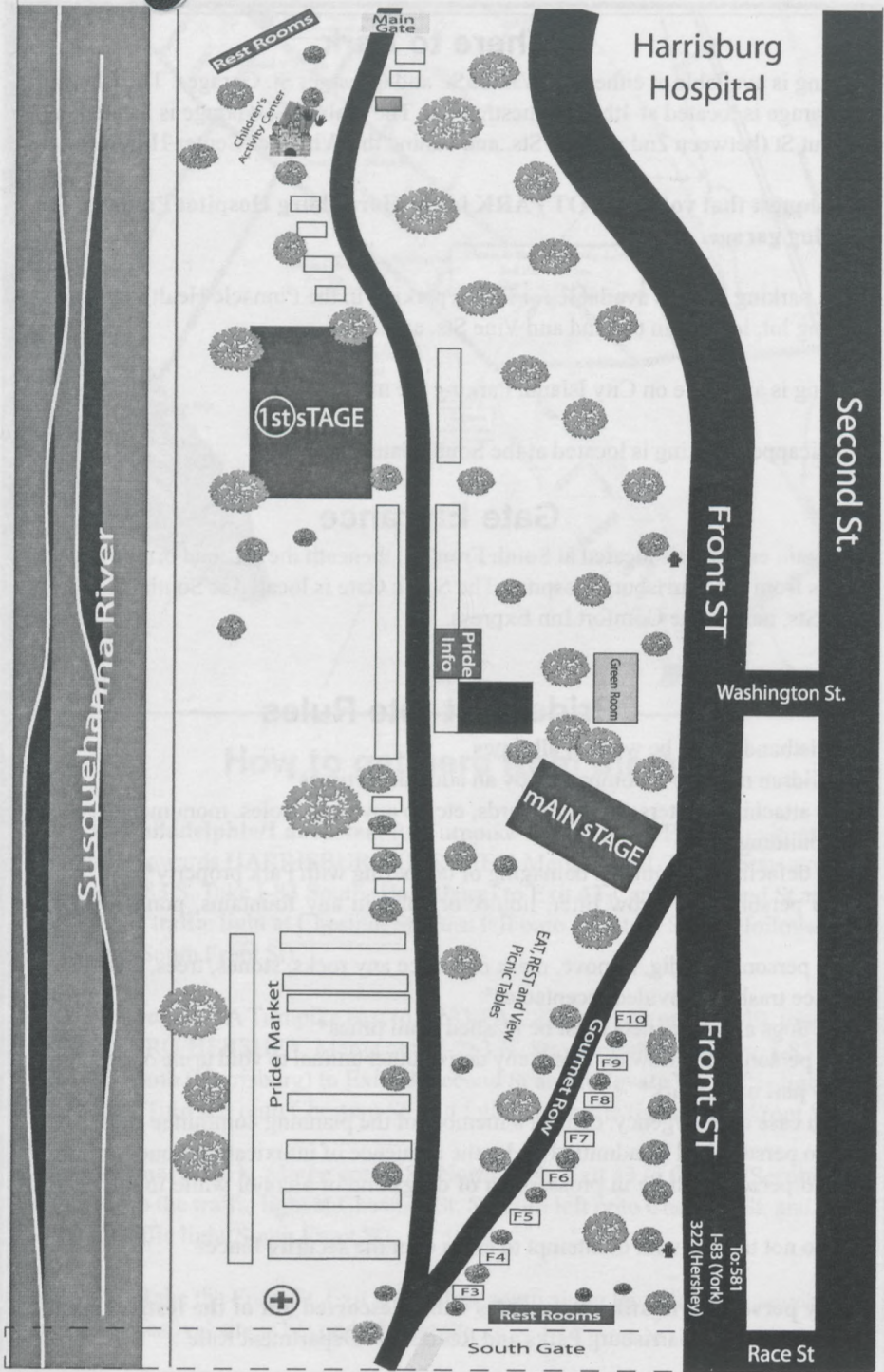
The main entrance is located at South Front St., beneath the railroad bridge and across from the Harrisburg Hospital. The South Gate is located at South Front and Vine Sts. next to the Comfort Inn Express.

Pride Fest Site Rules

- 1) Wristbands must be worn at all times
- 2) Children must be accompanied by an adult at all times*
- 3) No attaching posters, signs, placards, etc, to any trees, poles, monuments, or buildings*
- 4) No defacing, disfiguring, damaging or tampering with Park property*
- 5) No person shall throw litter, liquid, or solid in any fountains, ponds, lakes or rivers*
- 6) No person shall dig, remove, mark or deface any rocks, stones, trees, etc.*
- 7) Place trash in provided receptacles*
- 8) All dogs and other pets must be leashed at all times*
- 9) No person shall allow or permit any dog or other animal to void urine or excrement in any part of the park*
- 10) In case of emergency, contact a member of the planning committee staff
- 11) No person shall be admitted under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs*
- 12) No person shall be in possession of drugs and/or alcohol while in the festival area*
- 13) Do not tamper with or attempt to cross over the security fence

Any person(s) violating these rules will be escorted out of the festival area.

- * Faintness
- * Rapid Heart Beat
- * Ashen appearance
- * Cold, clammy skin
- * Nausea
- * Symptoms begin suddenly

You should:

- * Move person to a shady area
- * Have someone contact the Festival Staff or run for EMS at the South Entrance
- * Have a person lay down and elevate feet
- * Loosen light clothing

If someone exhibits:

- * Fever
- * Rapid Heart Beat
- * Rapid & Shallow Breathing
- * Confusion
- * Seizure

Then:

- * Summon Festival Staff and EMS IMMEDIATELY
- * Move person to a shady area
- * Cover with damp sheets/clothing, or spray with water
- * Give air and fan

Press Policy for PRIDE Fest 2002

In order to ensure the right of privacy to be enjoyed by all that attend Pride Fest 2002, it shall be the policy of the Board of Directors and the Public Relations Committee to work with the media in the following manner:

1. To send press releases to media representatives within one month of any Pride Fest sponsored event.
2. To refer all questions and requests to the Pride Fest spokesperson as designated by the standard operating procedures or, in lieu thereof, the Board of Directors.
3. To request that the media refrain from using still cameras or any type of video photography unless they have the consent of the intended photographic subjects.

Print and other news journalists will be permitted to mingle amongst participants if they so choose. It will be made clear, however, that the **privacy of all attendees must be respected.**

EQUITY FOR GAYS AND LESBIANS

The Equity for Gays and Lesbians Partnership Fund, known as EGAL, is a project of The Greater Harrisburg Foundation and a community partner of the National Lesbian and Gay Community Funding Partnership (NLGCF). EGAL has been awarded a \$100,000 grant to fund organizations providing services to lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) person in the region encompassing Adams, Dauphin, Franklin, Lancaster, Perry, and York counties. EGAL's goal is to match this grant with another \$100,000 in local funds to be earmarked for programs and services offered by local service organizations.

To date, EGAL has raised over \$55,000, much of which has been a result of proceeds from the 2000 and 2001 annual Fall Achievement Benefit (FAB) fundraisers. This year's FAB event will be held on October 11 th at the Whitaker Center for Science & the Arts. The EGAL Task Force would like to expand the scope of its fundraising to include donations from individuals who are supporters of gay and lesbian issues. I invite you to be a part of this initiative by making a personal donation to EGAL to support services to the gay and lesbian community. *Your gift will be matched, dollar for dollar, by the national organization and will go directly to LGBT service organizations to address the unmet needs of the gay and lesbian persons.*

The priority areas identified in this assessment include legal assistance, referral programs for health and wellness services, domestic partnership rights, hate crimes, discrimination, workplace rights, and community/media education. 2002 represents the third year that we will provide funding for organizations that work to fill the gaps in these and other services and programs that improve the quality of life for gays and lesbians.

Currently, less than 0.3% of philanthropic dollars are designated for LGBT issues. Please help with our efforts to positively impact this disparity by giving as generously as your circumstances allow.
