Legislative Committee of the Pennsylvania Rural Gay Caucus

Fellow Committee Member:

The next meeting of the Legislative Committee will be held on Thursday, June 24, at 7:30 in the evening. The meeting will be at my apartment, which is #5 at 3358 East Boulevard, Bethlehem. To get here, the simplest way is to get yourself onto U.S. Route 22. Then:

Take the Nazareth Pike, Pa. Route 191, exit. This is the last Bethlehem exit (follows Center Street) for eastbound traffic, the first Bethlehem exit (follows ~~X~~ Pa. Rte. 33) for westbound. When you reach the stop sign at the bottom of the ramp, turn left onto Nazareth Pike; this is toward Bethlehem. Travel one mile (I clocked it as 1.05 miles); look to the left, and discover a sign announcing "Liberty Park Apartments". (Note: if you make a mistake, and end up coming to this sign from the other direction, it advertises "Freedom Estates".) Turn left onto East Boulevard just past the sign (the street is not marked). Then, turn left into the first driveway, and proceed to the far end of the farther parking lot. My building is on the left, and the entrance is nearest the end of the lot.

We had a successful joint meeting with our counterparts from the Governor's Council in Philadelphia, although I missed several of you. The effort to move along with the Sodomy bill seems most desirable, with the hope that it might be introduced in September. However, to make this a success will require work.

I enclose several Evaluation Sheets which I hope you will put to use; return them to me after filling them out.
