Following the Hally, awo showings of the noted film, "Yord is Cut" will be scheduled at 3:30 and 6:30 P.N. at the Afro-American Cultural Center, Sixth and Chev Streets. And, to wind up the day's events, a dance has been scheduled at the Center beginning at 10:00 (which may feature a live band, if funding permits). Tickets for the film are being distributed for a \$2.00 dimation before the event, \$3.00 at the door, and the dance will cost \$1.00 per person.
