AUGUST MEETING MOTES

The August 6th, 1977 aroting of the Pa, Rural Gay Caucus was held in Union Terrace Park in Allentown. Eleven people attended.

1. At present there is 261 dellars and some odd cents in the Caucus

Treasury.

2. Rural Conferences obtaining a suitable site for october has proved a more difficult and time consuming task than originally calculated. Though campsites are still being investigated, we are turning our attention to making arrangements for the conference in Harrisburg. (See below under

Conference)

3. Allentoum Gay Fights: The Human Relations Commission in Allentoum on July 20 passed a resolution (5-3-1) asking City Jouncil to adopt a protecive clause for gays into its non-discriminations ordinance. This issue is due to be taken by City Council after elections in the Fall. The controversy rages in the allentoum/bethlehen Area, mainly through the Letters to the Editor columns of the local papers. The issue may eventually come down to a referendum. Local activists will be forming a Gay Rights Coalition. to fight the opposition and to educate the ill-informed.

5. the proposed by-laws amendmentwas tabled because it was felt the Gaucus was not well enough represented at the meeting to act on a by-laws m

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE BYTANS

According the Dy-Laus, a proposed Amendment must appear in the newsleter prior to adoption. The amendment reads "that the deadline for the publication of the Gaucus Newsletter be set at 15 days prior to the meeting, and that in the event this deadline cannot be met, that the Co-Chairs be notified and made responsible for seeing to a simple notification by mail of the time and place of the meeting no less than tem days prior to the meeting." If and then the resolution is adopted a By-Laws Committee must be convened to write the actual language to be used.

The COULTERENCE

The Proposed Conference has been rescheduled for January or February under the joint sponsorship of the Caucus and the Governor's Council on Samual Hinorities (pending formal approval by the latter body. A maeting of the Conference Committee following the Caucus will select the site for the Conference and a few other major decksions.
