It will also incorporate a calendar of events, so that individuals as well as other organizations in the "rural" areas of Pennsylvania will be aware of what is happening and being accomplished in neighboring gay communities. Some of the topics discussed at the November 1st Meeting in Lancaster were: Adding 2 more members to the Governor's Gay Task Force; changing he number of Rural Representatives from 4 to 6.

-2. Ways in which each Rural Representative may work most effectively

reaching all of us within the vast outlying state areas.

-3. Adopting a "Big-Sister/Big-Brother" type program to help people "come-out", educate them, and develop their gay pride and gay awareness as individuals.

-4. Share ideas through communicating with each other as individuals and as groups.

-5. Establish a form of newsletter, where input and circulation would be almost immediate keeping all of us informed.

-6. Media-news coverage for your group's events. Attempt to get sitive coverage of the gay minority, utilize TV, radio, newspapers and any other public facility as a means of contact for us to reach each other.

he second meeting of the Rural Caucus will be held in Allentown at the Unitarian Church of the Lehigh Valley (map enclosed) on Saturday December 6th at 1:00 PM. Le-Hi-Ho will be the host organization for this meeting. Recommendations are to be made to the Governor's Gay Task Force well as to other gay organizations within the state.

SENATE BILLS:::196 & 743:::!!

On Tuesday October 21st, Governor Shapp vetoed Senate Bill 196, saying the measure was "vindictive ... and a setback to the cause of fair and equal opportunity. All my life I have fought to end barriers against persons or groups. At this time I do not intend to traffic in demagoguery and reaction by signing a bill so clearly unfair ... the worst written bill I have received in five years as governor." Unless emergency measures are successful, it is expected that these bills "111 have enough support to pass, even over the governor's veto. It is of URGENT IMPORTANCE that letters are written--IMMEDIATELY in order to stop these bills from becoming law. WRITE!!! If you don't know who your State Rep's are--find out from the Library. Contact Church Groups that have endorsed our struggle on a national basis; e.g. The United Church of Christ, The United Methodist Church, The Unitarian Church, The Society of Friends, The Episcopal Church, The Lutheran Church, The Presbyterian Church, B'nai-B'rith, ADA, Labor Unions, NAACP, Urban League, etc., etc., etc. Ask THEM to write also, they probably would and will if you let them know What's going on in Harrisburg--the "straight" press isn't giving the matter
