



Collectively, we have allowed ourselves to create a safe space in which all can come to the table welcomed and express their spirits. May your spirit be uplifted by the sights and sounds of our "WomanSpirit!"

According to the Yoga Journal (www.yogajournal.com), "the gesture Namaste represents the belief that there is a Divine spark within each of us that is located in the heart chakra.... To perform Namaste, we place the hands together at the heart chakra, close the eyes, and bow the head. It can also be done by placing the hands together in front of the third eye, bowing the head, and then bringing the hands down to the

heart. This is an especially deep form of respect.

"In India it is understood that the gesture itself signifies Namaste, and therefore, it is unnecessary to say the word while bowing."


Patricia George, Bass


