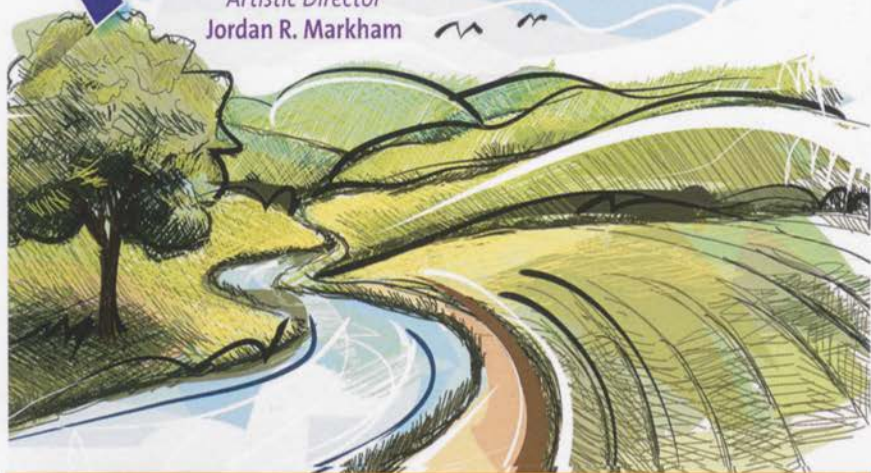

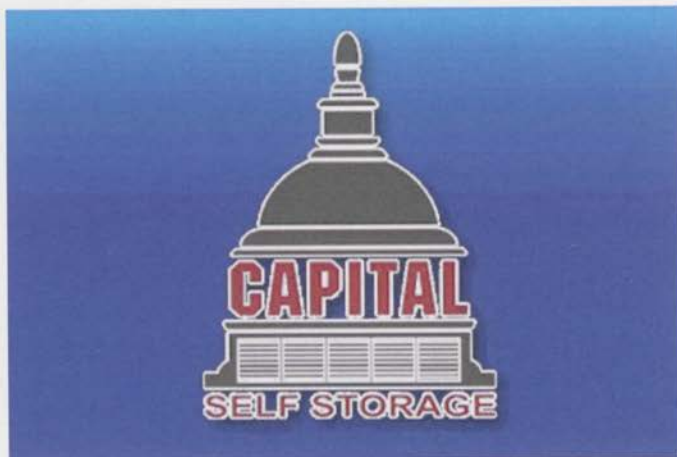

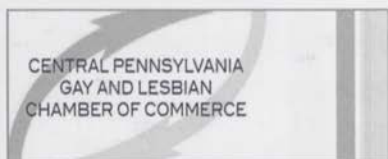

Come Sail Away was written in 1987 and was one of progressive rock band Styx's biggest hits. It was most recently used in trailers for the Disney film *Moana*.

Adiemus Karl Jenkins

Adiemus is the first movement of Karl Jenkin's *Song of Sanctuary*. The text was written with the invented words viewed as instrumental sound with a world music feel. "The sound is universal as is the language of music," notes Jenkins.

Bring Me Little Water, Silvy Huddie Ledbetter (Leadbelly)

Leadbelly (1888-1949) wrote some of the most beloved American songs, writing and performing in his own folk blues style. This song was said to have been written about the composer's uncle and aunt. This arrangement was inspired by the version performed by Sweet Honey in the Rock.

Cups (When I'm Gone) A.P. Carter, Luisa Gerstein,
and Heloise Tunstall-Behrens
Arr. by Deke Sharon

Cups was written by A. P. Carter of the Carter Family in 1931 as *When I'm Gone*. The Carter Family and its various incarnations had a profound effect on folk, country, bluegrass, gospel, rock and pop music. This version appeared in the movie *Pitch Perfect 2*.

Ban, Ban, Caliban Music by Dan Forrest
Text by William Shakespeare

Ban, Ban, Caliban's text is from Shakespeare's *The Tempest*. Caliban is a half-human, bumbling, monstrous servant of the sorcerer Prospero. They live on a desolate island. The text is a jubilant song that Caliban sings when he renounces service to Prospero and swears allegiance to two shipwrecked men with a cache of liquor.

Steam Heat is from the 1954 musical *Pajama Game*. This number introduced the signature style of choreographer Bob Fosse, with its minimalist but riveting dance moves.

My Heart Will Go On Music by James Horner

My Heart Will Go On, from the movie *Titanic*, is one of the world's best selling singles, and invokes admiration and disdain in equal proportions. *Titanic* featured the fictional characters Jack and Rose (already engaged to a rich man who gives her a beautiful jewel) who fall in love on the journey. It is a love story doomed by the depths of the Atlantic. Spoiler alert: The ship sinks. Jack dies.

Come Rain or Come Shine was written for the musical *St. Louis Woman* in 1946, it has been recorded in every decade since by many famous singers, including Bob Dylan in 2016.

The idea behind *Africa* was described by one of its composers in the band Toto as "a white boy is trying to write a song on Africa, but since he's never been there, he can only tell what he's seen on TV." It hit #1 on the charts in 1983. It's been featured in ads, TV shows and video games. It's been listed as having one of pop music's "most explosive choruses."

Shenandoah *Arr. by Patricia Hennings*
Sponsored by Darla Henry

Shenandoah was a riverman's and then sailor's song dating from the early 1800's. It went through numerous changes and versions over the years and centuries, and still has many versions. Some lyrics refer to Shenandoah not as a river but as an Indian chief. In the standard version, the Missouri is the only river featured in the song.

Midas Turned His Child To Gold Florence March

The composer is a CPWC member who explains: "Our concert is about water. *Midas Turned His Child To Gold* was inspired by the ongoing protests against the Dakota Access Pipeline. The protesters called themselves 'Water Protectors' and passionately brought attention to the threat that the pipeline posed to the water sources in its path. The song builds on the Greek myth about King Midas who was thrilled that he could turn everything that he touched to gold, until he touched his own child and turned her into a statue. In the same way, there are those who are taking our most precious assets, our water, air, and land and destroying them for money. Our children's future depends on our vigilance in protecting these resources."

Down By the Riverside *Arr. by Kirby Shaw*

The roots of this African-American spiritual date back to before the Civil War but was first published in 1918 and first recorded in 1920. While the primary message is about baptism and heaven, it also referred to escape from slavery, as do many spirituals. The river was the Ohio River, a border between slave and free states. Because of its pacifist imagery, *Down by the Riverside* has also been used as an anti-war protest song, especially during the Vietnam War.

He has been active in the musical scene for the past decade directing, accompanying, and acting in theaters throughout Pennsylvania and Maryland. He is currently serving as Director of Music Ministries at Wesley United Methodist Church of Bloomsburg.

Arthur M. Thompson, Accompanist, is a graduate of Shenandoah Conservatory of Music and continued his music education at various institutions and with noted pianists. He is currently the organist at the First Presbyterian Church of Carlisle. He also accompanies Cantante Carlisle, South Middleton School District, Big Spring School District and Cumberland Valley School District. He has been music director and accompanist for over 60 mid-state theater productions and teaches piano to private students.



Renee Bartholomew, percussion, and **Pat George, percussion and bass,** have played with many area bands. They often join CPWC's performances.


