Three years before Ellen Degeneres came out on national television, a band of lesbian and feminist women came together to form the Central Pennsylvania Womyn's Chorus. Their aim was the same as it is today: to give voice to our community. Since then, the Womyn's Chorus has been a place for countless women to each find their own voice, a voice they may have thought was lost.

We remember how lesbians and feminists were perceived in 1994. For some, it was mostly negative, if we were thought of at all. So our mission was two-fold – create beautiful music and, by being ourselves, show who feminist women and lesbians truly are.

The Womyn's Chorus has given our voices for our community, as well. We sang to prevent domestic violence and fight breast cancer and to support survivors, to build bridges with immigrant and refugee women, to help Afghan women and families here at home, to promote Pride and solidarity, and so much more.

I must express my deep gratitude to those who helped make tonight possible: to each singer and their dedication to the music, to Artistic Director Jordan Markham for bringing their voices forth into one beautiful whole (and for playing the piano at the Spaghetti Dinner), to the super-talented Tyler Canonico, our Collaborative Pianist, to our hard-working Board of Directors, and to our very helpful hosts. We also thank you for being here today, marking and making history with us.

The seed was planted by Donna Gomboc, our founding mothers, and Dan Krynak all those years ago. There is no greater sense of accomplishment than to continue with the vision they had, evolving as we must, far into the future. We proudly celebrate where we've been and plan for unmatched live performances in the years ahead. Let's move forward together! To quote one of tonight's songs: how can we keep from singing?!

Jordan R. Markham, Artistic Director, studied at The Peabody Conservatory of The Johns Hopkins University. He is a classically-trained singer, having studied under Grammy-winning baritone William Sharp and soprano Susan Solomon Beckley of Bucknell University. He was a chorister at The National Cathedral and a chorister and soloist in The Handel Choir of Baltimore. Throughout the past decade, Jordan has performed with The Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, as well as at Carnegie Hall, the Boston Symphony Hall, and the Jackie Gleason Theatre. He has been active in the musical scene for the past decade directing, accompanying, and acting in theaters throughout Pennsylvania and Maryland. He is currently serving as Director of Music Ministries at Wesley United Methodist Church of Bloomsburg.

Tyler A. Canonico, Collaborative Pianist, “one of east coast’s finest young concert organists and inspiring church musicians,” is Minister of Music and Organist at Market Square Presbyterian Church in Harrisburg. In addition to his work, he is the organist for the Harrisburg Symphony, is a co-founding member of Allegro con Fuoco, and is the Sub Dean for the Harrisburg Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. His education includes a Master of Music in organ performance from the University of Alabama and a Bachelor of Arts in organ performance and sacred music from Lebanon Valley College.

Twenty-five years and still singing...

Once upon a time...a woman attended the 1993 Gay Pride Festival and heard the Harrisburg Men's Chorus sing. She was so inspired, she asked to join. Instead, leaders helped her start a women's chorus. A year later in 1994, the Central Pennsylvania Womyn's Chorus debuted at Pride. In 1995, the Chorus performed several times including two full-length concerts.

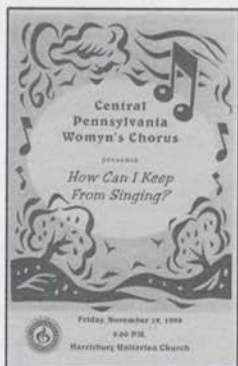

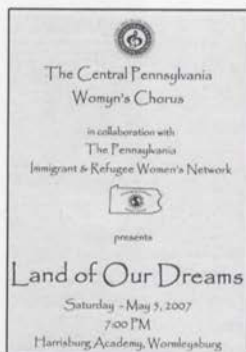


Chorus members sang at the GALA Choruses Festival in Montreal, Canada in July 2004. As a result, the Chorus was invited to participate in a mass chorus at Carnegie Hall in 2004.



In 2006, the Chorus was asked to leave their rehearsal church; board members implied that gay people could not be religious! This inspired new artistic director Giesala Collins to develop the Woman Spirit concert, which the chorus also took to the 2006 Sister Singers Festival in San Diego.

Our 2007 concert, in collaboration with the PA Immigrant and Refugee Women's Network (PAIRWN), gave immigrant women a chance to tell their stories.



The Chorus sang for Christmas at the Governor's Residence in 2008. Gov. Rendell posed with us; his wife, a former opera singer, was also in the audience.

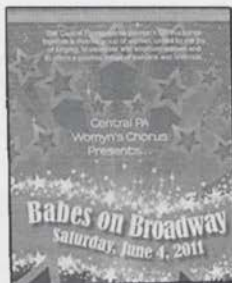


The chorus marched in 2010 in the parade for the Pride Festival of Central PA.

In addition to our concerts, the Chorus participated in many other musical activities during its first decade -- Pride festivals, community festivals, women's festivals and conferences, commemorations, and ordinations. Our events and concerts showed our commitment to gay/lesbian and women's issues like domestic violence, breast cancer and AIDS.

In 2016, the Chorus made its second appearance at the GALA Festival, appearing in Denver before an audience of 2,000 and earning six standing ovations. The Festival is held every four years. We'll be singing at the Festival in Minneapolis in July 2020.

Each June at MCC, CPWC sponsors a dinner for people affected by HIV/AIDS.



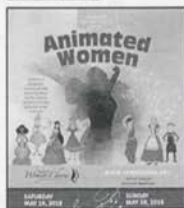
